RONALD REAGAN STAMP TO BE REISSUED

WASHINGTON – The U.S. Postal Service will reissue the Ronald Reagan Commemorative postage stamp at the 39-cent First-Class rate. The stamp issue date will be announced shortly. The new stamp will bear the same image as the 37-cent stamp issued Feb. 9, 2005.

On Jan. 8, 2006, the price of First-Class postage increased to 39 cents. Customers should feel free to use the 37-cent Ronald Reagan stamp in conjunction with a 2-cent Navajo Jewelry stamp when mailing letters. Limited quantities of the 37-cent Ronald Reagan stamp may be purchased online at The Postal Store at www.usps.com/shop or by calling toll free 1-800-STAMP-24. The Navajo Jewelry stamp is also available in Post Offices.
