Swearing-in: Patrick R. Donahoe is new Deputy PMG and Chief Operating Officer

It's official. Patrick R. Donahoe is the Postal Service's™ 19th deputy postmaster general and chief operating officer.

Donahoe took the oath of office Wednesday, June 22, during a swearing-in ceremony in the Hall of Flags at Postal Service Headquarters, Washington, DC. Donahoe was sworn in by Postmaster General (PMG) Jack Potter.

Announcing Donahoe's appointment earlier this year, Board of Governors Chairman James Miller and PMG Potter said Donahoe's performance, experience and commitment to the continued transformation and success of the Postal Service make him uniquely suited to the role.

Donahoe joined USPS® as a clerk in 1975. He has been senior vice president of Operations, senior vice president of Human Resources and vice president of Area Operations for the former Allegheny Area. He was appointed chief operating officer (COO) in Sept. 2001.

"Pat has gained an invaluable perspective on the challenges facing the organization and developed a real-world approach to meeting them," Miller and Potter said.

Donahoe is credited with helping USPS achieve record levels of service, with overnight on-time delivery performance at 95 percent and customer satisfaction at 94 percent. Over the same period, USPS experienced sustained workplace improvements and is on track for a sixth straight year of productivity gains.

In his new position, Donahoe serves as a member of the USPS Board of Governors and retains responsibility for mail processing, transportation and delivery, field operations, engineering, delivery and retail, facilities and network operations — all activities he performed as COO.

Donahoe has a bachelor's degree in economics from the University of Pittsburgh and earned his master's degree as a Sloan Fellow at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

Diversity honor: USPS Law department recognized, credits HR programs

The USPS Law department was honored for its commitment to diversity with a 2005 Special Achievement Award from the Minority Corporate Counsel Association on June 14 in Washington, DC.

The association is an advocate for diversity in the legal sector of corporate America. Each year it honors industry

leaders who have been successful in creating and maintaining an inclusive workplace.

"This award reflects the Law department's adoption of Postal Service-wide diversity policies and programs instituted by Human Resources and steps we've taken to integrate diversity into our workplace," says Senior Vice President and General Counsel Mary Anne Gibbons. "This award reflects very favorably on the entire Postal Service."

Stacking up packages: Carrier Pickup tops 10 million

The feature was launched nationally in February 2004 and six months later marked 1 million packages picked up. Carrier Pickup™ is attracting customers in droves — packages have topped a million a month since March 2005!

Connecting with success: More than 13,000 letter carriers have submitted leads

Letter carriers know a good lead when they see one — or thousands.

The Customer Connect™ program continues to celebrate million-dollar weeks, documenting annualized sales of more than \$1.4 million during the week of June 11 through June 17. This brings fiscal year (FY) 2005 Customer Connect revenue to more than \$48 million.

"That's spectacular," says Customer Development Manager De-Borah Honore. "The number of letter carriers participating in the program continues to increase. Carriers are motivated. Small business specialists and sales personnel are doing a great job closing the deals."

Since Customer Connect was launched January 2004, it's brought in \$89 million in revenue for the Postal Service. Carrier participation has increased to 26%. More than 13,000 letter carriers have submitted leads.

Expect the numbers to grow. The program will expand to an additional 3,000 sites by the end of FY 2005.

Skin cancer: Are you at risk?

Sun seekers, take heed. Too much fun in the sun may mean overexposure that can lead to skin irritation, sunburn — even skin cancer.

The American Academy of Dermatology says one in five Americans will develop skin cancer during their lifetime.

At risk are people with fair to light skin tones or a family history of skin cancer. Darker skins tones contain greater concentrations of melanin, the substance that produces skin tone. While melanin is activated in the sun, it is not a repellent to the sun's potentially harmful rays.

"Everyone can benefit from wearing sunscreen with a sun protective factor (SPF) of at least 15," says USPS National Medical Director David Reid.

Dermatologists also recommend these tips to avoid the searing effects of too much sun:

- Avoid peak sunlight hours. Plan outdoor activities early or late in the day.
- Wear protective, tightly woven clothing.
- Apply sunscreen of at least SPF 15 on all exposed parts of the body.

- Apply sunscreen at least 20 minutes before going out and every 90 minutes thereafter.
- Wear a wide-brimmed hat and sunglasses.
- Seek shade whenever possible.

Examine your skin monthly, looking closely between toes, on the soles of your feet, under your arms and on your scalp and back. Watch for unusual moles or discolorations of the skin. And get checkups every six months. The American Academy of Dermatology has more information at 888-462-DERM (3376) or www.aad.org.

DMM REVISION

Premium Forwarding Service

Effective August 7, 2005, *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 709.8 is added to provide the rates and fees, eligibility criteria, standards, and classification information for the 2-year Premium Forwarding Service (PFS) experiment.

The Postal Service™ is conducting this nationwide experiment to measure interest in a new service that ships mail to residential customers who are away from their primary address for at least 2 weeks and up to 1 year. PFS generally provides a shipment of a customer's mail every Wednesday from their primary address to their temporary address by Priority Mail® service. Customers pay an initial enrollment fee of \$10, plus a weekly per-shipment charge of \$10.

Express Mail® and Priority Mail packages that are too large to fit inside the weekly PFS package are immediately and separately rerouted at no additional charge. Package Services parcels that are too large to fit inside the PFS package are rerouted with postage due. All mail requiring a delivery scan or a signature also is separately rerouted. Customers cannot have a temporary or permanent forwarding order active with enrollment in PFS.

Look for the Premium Forwarding Service Field Implementation Kit in the July 7 *Postal Bulletin*. It provides more information about the PFS experiment, along with helpful tools for Post Offices™.

We will incorporate these revisions into the printed version of the DMM and into the August update of the online version available via Postal Explorer® at *pe.usps.com*.

8.0 Premium Forwarding Service

8.1 Description and Purpose

Premium Forwarding Service (PFS) is a 2-year experiment that, upon payment of postage and fees, provides residential delivery customers and certain post office box

customers an option to have all mail addressed to their primary address reshipped or rerouted to a temporary address mainly by means of a weekly Priority Mail shipment. PFS is available for a period of not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year. This optional service is in addition to the current piece-by-piece forwarding service currently offered by USPS, whereby only certain mailpieces are forwarded.

8.2 Eligibility

8.2.1 Use

Participation in PFS is subject to the following standards:

- PFS is available to residential delivery customers and all size-one or size-two post office box customers.
- A customer must submit a completed PFS application, Form 8176, to the post office (or a station or branch of that post office) responsible for delivery to the customer's primary address. The enrollment fee and reshipment charges for the full duration of requested service must accompany the application form.
- Customers must designate on the application form whether the order is for an "individual" or an "entire household."
- PFS is available for a period of not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year.
- PFS is available only from and to domestic addresses.
- PFS is available to, but not from, central point delivery addresses, APO and FPO addresses, and U.S. State Department addresses.

8.2.2 Prohibited Use

Customers cannot have a temporary or permanent forwarding order active simultaneously with enrollment in PFS. PFS cannot be combined with any ancillary or extra services beyond those purchased by the original sender. In addition, PFS is not available for:

- Customers whose primary address is a size-three, size-four, or size-five post office box. Residential customers who use these post office box sizes due to the unavailability of smaller boxes may request a waiver of this restriction.

- b. Customers whose primary address is a business delivery address.
- c. Customers whose primary address is a central point to which the USPS provides delivery in bulk to a third party, such as a commercial mail receiving agency (CMRA), RV park, trailer park, or hotel.

8.3 Rates and Fees

8.3.1 Enrollment

Customers must pay a \$10.00 nonrefundable enrollment fee.

8.3.2 Charge Per Reshipment

The reshipment charge for each Priority Mail shipment is \$10.00 for each week of service requested.

8.4 Extension or Early Termination

8.4.1 Early Termination of Service

A customer who terminates PFS early (e.g., a customer prepays for 10 weeks but returns to a primary address after 8 weeks) may request a refund for any unused weekly shipment charges from the post office serving the primary address. The enrollment fee is nonrefundable.

8.4.2 Extension of Service

A PFS customer may contact the post office responsible for delivery to the primary address prior to the termination date and extend PFS service (up to 1 year maximum service from the initial start date) as needed. An extension is processed only after the post office receives payment of all postage and fees for the extension.

8.5 Disposition of PFS Mail

8.5.1 Weekly Priority Mail Reshipments

Regardless of any endorsement on a mailpiece, all mail is reshipped in the weekly Priority Mail shipment, except as specified in 5.2 through 5.5.

8.5.2 Mailpieces Requiring a Scan or Signature at Delivery

Mailpieces requiring a scan or signature at delivery (e.g., Express Mail, Certified Mail, numbered insured mail, mailpieces with Delivery Confirmation) are appropriately scanned, then immediately and separately rerouted to the temporary address, subject to the following:

- a. Express Mail, Priority Mail, and First-Class Mail are rerouted at no additional charge.
- b. Standard Mail and Package Services mailpieces are rerouted postage due at the appropriate Priority Mail rate.

8.5.3 Priority Mail Not Requiring a Scan or Signature at Delivery

Priority Mail that does not require a scan or signature at delivery is immediately and separately rerouted to the temporary address, unless it will fit into the weekly Priority

Mail shipment and such inclusion does not delay its delivery to the temporary address.

8.5.4 Large Packages Not Requiring a Scan or Signature at Delivery

Packages that do not fit into the weekly Priority Mail shipment and do not require a scan or signature at delivery are separately rerouted to the temporary address, subject to the following:

- a. First-Class Mail and Periodicals parcels (firm bundles) are rerouted at no additional charge.
- b. Standard Mail and Package Services parcels are rerouted postage due at the appropriate Priority Mail rate.
- c. Oversized Parcel Post parcels are rerouted postage due at the appropriate oversized Parcel Post rate.

8.5.5 Mailpieces Arriving Postage Due at the Primary Address

Any mailpiece arriving postage due at the post office serving a PFS customer's primary address is not reshipped in the weekly Priority Mail shipment and will be rerouted individually. Pieces arriving postage due are rerouted as follows:

- a. Postage due First-Class Mail pieces are rerouted as First-Class Mail postage due. Only the original postage due amount is collected. There is no additional charge for rerouting the mailpiece.
- b. Postage due Priority Mail pieces are rerouted as Priority Mail postage due. Only the original postage due amount is collected. There is no additional charge for rerouting the mailpiece.
- c. Postage due for all Package Services pieces, other than oversized Parcel Post pieces, are rerouted as Priority Mail. The total postage due for Package Services pieces is the sum of the postage due at the time of receipt at the primary post office plus the postage due for rerouting the piece from the primary post office to the temporary post office at the appropriate Priority Mail rate.
- d. Postage due oversized Parcel Post pieces are rerouted as Parcel Post. The total postage due is the sum of the postage due at the time of receipt at the primary post office and the postage due for rerouting the piece from the primary post office to the temporary post office at the appropriate oversized Parcel Post rate.

8.6 USPS Responsibility

The delivery post office serving a PFS customer's primary address must:

- a. Prepare and send the PFS shipments once each week, on Wednesdays.

- b. Ensure that PFS shipments end in accordance with the original or revised end date specified on the application form, and that delivery to the primary address begins (or holding mail commences under 507.3.4.4) as designated by the customer.
- c. Ensure that Label 85 (Permit No. G-400) is properly affixed to each reshipped PFS Priority Mail package. Postage meter or PVI postage must not be affixed.

Fourth of July Safety

“Ladies and gentlemen, start your engines!”

But before you turn the key, always remember: “Safety first.”

Summer fun in the sun is in full swing, and strong emphasis on your safety is vital. Postal Service™ employees and their families will continue to drive great distances for work and to visit their families and friends. Swimming, boating, off-road driving, barbecuing, and fireworks are popular activities for the Fourth of July holiday. Whatever your plans, vigorously pursue and adopt a risk management plan before you get underway for the holiday celebration.

Exercise forethought and common sense when engaging in any activity. To meet the challenge of this extended Fourth of July weekend, keep in mind some safety hints to minimize risks in order to avoid death and injury.

- **Driving:** Here are some tips for highway trips:
 - If you are highway bound, make sure your vehicle is in excellent operating condition. Always carry a roadside emergency and first aid kit, and also remember to bring extra water, especially in hot climates.
 - Put on a safety belt first thing when you get in a car — it takes only 3 seconds. Putting on a safety belt is a simple habit and can make all the difference between walking away from a crash and being carried off on a stretcher.
 - Keep children safe. The back seat is the safest place for children to ride, and use the correct safety equipment to protect all children.
 - Don’t speed. Speeding reduces a driver’s ability to steer safely around curves or objects in the road. You never know what’s around that next corner: a deer, stalled car, or pedestrian in the roadway.
 - Most importantly, do not drink and drive — and equally importantly, don’t get into a vehicle with a driver who has been drinking.

- **Swimming:** Use common sense: swim where life-guards are present. They are trained to identify hazards and help you if you get in trouble. Also, never dive unless you know the water depth and what obstacles are below. Don’t let a bad decision leave you paralyzed for life.
- **Boating:** Take a boating course, file a float plan, never exceed the boat’s maximum capacity, wear a personal flotation device (PFD), keep an eye on the weather, and save the alcohol for later.
- **Off-road driving:** Get training before operating a vehicle or an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) off-road, and then start out slowly. Knowing the condition and route you’re going to take allows you to alter speed as necessary in areas with limited visibility or poor road conditions. Maintain proper speed, and wear personal protective equipment (PPE).
- **Barbecue safety:** Follow manufacturer’s instructions for lighting and extinguishing gas grills. There is a right way and a wrong way. Postal Service employees and their families have been severely burned when gas buildups have led to explosions.
- **Fireworks:** The best advice: leave them to the professionals. If fireworks are legal in your area and you decide to light off a few, use caution! Follow the manufacturer’s instructions for use. Careless use of fireworks can cause serious injury or death.
- **Heat:** When the heat is on, it may be harder to work safely. Drink water often. Dress lightly and choose fabrics that let moisture and heat escape. When possible, take breaks, move to a cooler area, or periodically change to lighter work.

Think before you act. Basic precautions for prevention of mishaps — while in the home, on the waterways, on the ball field, on the highway, and at work — will make this Fourth of July a safe and happy one, and one that you will live to talk about.

VEHICLE MAINTENANCE FACILITIES

Safety and Health Inspections

Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM) 824, Safety and Health Inspections, requires safety and health inspections of Postal Service™ installations, including Vehicle Maintenance Facilities (VMFs).

For VMFs with 100 or more employees, the servicing safety office must conduct and document the semi-annual inspections. For VMFs with fewer than 100 employees, the designated and trained VMF collateral duty facility safety coordinator (FSC) must conduct and document the annual inspection.

For both types of VMFs, VMF managers must use inspection checklists to conduct the inspections. You can find the VMF inspection checklists and inspection instructions on the Postal Service Intranet:

- Go to <http://blue.usps.gov>.
- Click on *Inside USPS*.
- Under “Headquarters, Human Resources” click on *Safety Resources*.
- Click on *Safety Checklists*.
- For the safety checklist, under “VMF,” click on *Safety and health checklists*. For the certification letter, click on *Safety and Health Inspection Certification*. For instructions, click on *Annual Safety and Health Inspection Letter of Instruction*.

VMF managers must:

1. Complete all VMF safety and health inspections and send the certification to the supporting safety office by September 5, 2005.

2. Post inspection results (see ELM 824.426).
3. Ensure all deficiencies are timely abated (see ELM 824.52).
4. Certify completion and abatement of the inspection to the servicing safety office.

FSCs may use the Safety Toolkit (see instructions below) to enter their inspection findings and generate the required safety and health inspection report. FSCs should request access to the Safety Toolkit from their servicing safety office manager.

Servicing safety office managers must enter the inspection completion dates in the scheduler provided in the Safety Toolkit available on the Postal Service Intranet:

- Go to <http://blue.usps.gov>.
- Click on *Inside USPS*.
- Under “Headquarters, Human Resources” click on *Safety Resources*.
- Click on *Toolkit Information*.
- Login to the Toolkit Web site.
- Click on *Inspections-New*.

Servicing safety office managers must also provide support to the managers in abating hazards as needed.

For technical and programmatic assistance, VMF managers should contact their servicing safety office.

Safety and Health Inspections — Level 20–26 Offices

Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM) 824.33, PC Installations with Less Than One Hundred Workyears, requires an annual safety and health inspection of main facilities, subordinate stations, and branches. Installation heads (IHs) in facilities without full-time safety personnel, or their management designees, act as the collateral duty facility safety coordinators (FSCs) (ELM 813.32, *Collateral Duty Facility Safety Coordinator*).

In offices with fewer than 100 employees, the FSC should lead the inspection (ELM 824.422, *Inspection Rules*). In offices with 100 or more employees in the main facility, the servicing safety office should conduct the inspection. However, the IH must ensure that subordinate stations and branches with fewer than 100 employees conduct their inspections.

The postmasters/IHs, or their designees, must:

1. Complete a safety and health inspection using the checklist within 30 days of the date of this *Postal Bulletin*.
2. Post the inspection.
3. Ensure abatement of all deficiencies in accordance with the instructions.
4. Certify completion of the inspection to the servicing safety office.

Household Diary Study

The Postal Service's™ Household Diary Study (HDS), conducted since 1987, provides information about the contents of the mail sent and received by U.S. households. The Postal Service uses this information to help understand why and how customers use the mail. The results are used to:

- Forecast mail volume.
- Plan marketing strategies.
- Provide information for rate-setting purposes.

The HDS is administered at Headquarters by the Office of Demand Forecasting and Economic Analysis, Finance. NuStats, the HDS survey research firm contractor since July 1999, conducts the interviews and collects and analyzes the HDS data throughout the year.

HDS is a two-stage survey. Stage 1 is the *Household Interview*. NuStats sends an advance letter, signed by the postmaster general, to a representative sample of U.S. households. This letter emphasizes the importance of the HDS and asks for participation. These sample households are contacted either by telephone or in person and asked about the mail they send and receive, their adoption and use of various communications' technologies, their attitudes about mail service in general, and information relating to their household and personal demographics. Those respondent households are recruited to participate in HDS Stage 2.

Stage 2 is the *Mail Diary*. NuStats asks households that agree to participate in Stage 2 to record information about the mail they send and receive for a 7-day period from Monday to Sunday. Information recorded includes number

of mailpieces received and sent, industry mail source, mail characteristics, and attitudes regarding mail received. As an incentive for HDS Stage 2 participation, households are offered the options of receiving \$30 or a roll of 100 First-Class Mail® stamps.

Customers who participate in Stage 2 of the HDS can expect to receive their incentive about 2 months after they return the diary packet to NuStats.

Data gathered in both HDS stages is available in a final report, "The Household Diary Study — Mail Use and Attitudes." The report is published in hard copy and a free electronic file. IMM AND PUBLICATION 51 REVISIONS

Suspension of International Economy Mail Services to Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, and Qatar

Effective June 23, 2005, all international economy mail services to Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, and Qatar are suspended due to a lack of surface transportation. This suspension will remain in effect until further notice.

However, this suspension of service does *not* affect International Surface Air Lift® (ISAL®) mail.

Postal Service™ facilities must return to the sender all international economy mail (except ISAL mail) addressed to Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, and Qatar and endorse it “Service Temporarily Suspended.” Customers may file an application for a refund of postage at their Post Office™ or retain the item for mailing once service resumes (see *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM®) 604.10).

We will incorporate these revisions into the printed version of *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 32 and into the next printed version of Publication 51, *International Postal Rates and Fees*, and also into the online versions of the IMM and Publication 51, both of which can be accessed via Postal Explorer® at <http://pe.usps.gov>.

The airplanes chosen for this new stamps pane depict American innovations and technological contributions to


military, commercial, and general aviation during the 1930s, '40s, and '50s.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM C024.2.0 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.


People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POSTMARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).



Official Holiday Closing Signs

The tear-out holiday closing signs previously published in the *Postal Bulletin* have been discontinued. Post Offices™, stations, and branches must display the official holiday closing signs that are included with the rest of the promotional point-of-purchase (POP) materials provided in the POP kit pack sent to each office every retail drive period. These signs depict all the holidays and dates that offices will be closed during the current drive period and are designed to be displayed on the exterior lobby entrance door of the facility.

The holiday closing signs are just one of a number of in-store elements that Retail Marketing produces and disseminates in order to communicate consistently with customers in Postal Service™ lobbies. The copy on these materials is crafted to provide customers with important information about postal products and services, alternate access, and customer convenience.

Signs that remain on display for long periods of time are referred to as Continuity POP elements. Those that change out with the retail drive period (a 2- to 4-month time frame dedicated to promote particular products and services) are called Promotional POP elements. Each Promotional element features an “up/down” symbol in the lower right-hand corner to convey when it’s to be displayed.

To meet local messaging needs, additional corporate-approved signage can be created via an application called MessageMaker 2 (MM2). MM2 houses approved art and copy for postcards and signage to support local promotions, communicate extended hours, announce grand openings, and more. Many of the items can be customized to reflect local hours and locations. Contact your district retail manager for more details and to order elements. To view the various elements available on MM2, go to <http://blue.usps.gov/advertising/>; click on *Field Advertising* under 1 Media.

Please help accomplish the Postal Service’s mission of standardizing the appearance of our retail lobbies by getting the right message in the right place at the right time. Directions for Using the Bill Validator Cleaning Card

Bill validator cleaning cards are used every time a vending machine is serviced. Proper use of this card will ensure that the vending machine does not become out of order because bills cannot be read correctly. The directions printed on the card are incorrect. A new supply of cleaning cards has been ordered with the correct directions.

Before using the bill validator cleaning card, consider the following points:

- **Keep away from heat and open flames.**
- The cleaning card contains 99% isopropyl alcohol.
- Alcohol evaporates from the cleaning card quickly.
- Do not open the cleaning card package until the validator is ready for cleaning.

The following directions must be followed when using the cleaning card:

1. Remove the cleaning card from the pouch and use it immediately.
2. While maintaining a firm grip on one end of the card, insert the other end of the card into the bill entrance slot.

3. Continue to maintain a firm grip on the cleaning card as the bill validator draws the card into the bill path.
4. Keep fingers against the bill entrance slot to keep the cleaning card in the bill path and, after a few seconds, start the jam-jog cycle. Do *not* let go of the cleaning card.
5. After about 30 seconds, pull the cleaning card from the bill validator after the jam-jog cycle *stops*.
6. Repeat steps 2 to 5, inserting the cleaning card in the other three directions.
7. Discard the card in a trash can after use. If the card still has black streak marks from the belt, insert a second card (or more) and follow the directions above in steps 1 to 6 as necessary until the card no longer shows black streaks from the dirty belts.



The Environmental & Maintenance and Repair Operations (MRO) Category Management Center (CMC) awarded contract number 2CESER-04-Q-4463 to Ecolab Pest Management Services (Ecolab) to provide a full range of integrated pest management (IPM) services. This

mandatory-use contract is to be utilized by all Postal Service™ locations within the 48 contiguous United States, Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands to obtain pest management services. Ecolab's catalog is now available on eBuy. If you have questions about the catalog,

please contact Ecolab at its Customer Service number 877-ECO-POST (877-326-7678).

The technical requirements for this national contract for IPM were based on the environmental Management Instruction (MI) AS-550-95-10, *Integrated Pest Management*. The MI describes the Postal Service's policies and procedures for an IPM program. Using appropriate technology and management practices, the IPM program emphasizes non-chemical over chemical control techniques, but does not eliminate the use of pesticides. Additionally, IPM is considered the "gold standard" of pest control service procedures in the industry. You can obtain a copy of the MI on the intranet at <http://blue.usps.gov/cpim/miid.htm>.

Standard periodic IPM service includes building inspection and treatment for mice and common insect problems found within the building and 10 feet beyond the exterior walls. Special services include inspection for subterranean termites, treatment of subterranean termites, mosquito treatment, bird deterrents, bird netting, removal of outside invaders, fire ant treatment, perimeter protection service, building repair (exclusion services), fly abatement service, and rodent device service. The standard commercial warranty applies. If a pest problem persists, contact Ecolab's Customer Service at 877-ECO-POST (877-326-7678) within 1 week of the original service and Ecolab will re-service at no additional cost. If warranty concerns are not resolved to your satisfaction, contact Janis Nichols, Environmental & MRO CMC at 214-819-7119.

Pest Management Services, was issued in June 2005, and is available at http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/operations/ops_mlb2004.htm. This document provides detailed instructions concerning order placement and reconciliation of the Billing Summary Report.

If you do not have an active infestation and need to reduce the annual cost, you might consider ordering services with less frequency (every 2 weeks instead of weekly or every 2 months instead of monthly). Before placing an order, you must have a valid FEDSTRIP number and follow locally established buying procedures.

If your facility has Internet access, and if you are currently obtaining pest control services from a supplier other than Ecolab, provide your local supplier with a 60- to 90-day termination notice and prepare an on-catalog eBuy requisition for Ecolab detailing the services needed.

If your facility does not have Internet access, orders should be placed by faxing or mailing an approved copy of PS Form 7381, *Requisition for Supplies, Services, or Equipment*, to 701-795-8025 or Ecolab Pest Management Services, PO Box 6007, Grand Forks, ND 58206-9983.
