Always on a Sunday

Beginning March 3, USPS will add a \$12.50 premium to the price of Express Mail delivered on Sundays and federal holidays.

The premium for “Sunday/Holiday Delivery” is intended to recover the cost of delivering on days when Post Offices are usually closed.

Customers whose Express Mail shipments would arrive on a Sunday or holiday — and who want a lower-cost option — can choose to have their packages delivered on Monday or the next business day after the holiday at the regular Express Mail price.

Service members update to Family and Medical Leave Act

There have been changes to the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) that every employee should know about. An update now entitles eligible employees to take leave for a covered family member’s service in the armed forces. This policy supplements current FMLA policy and provides notice of employee rights to such leave.

Service member FMLA provides eligible employees leave to care for a covered family member — spouse, parent, child or next of kin — who has incurred an injury or illness in the line of duty while on active duty in the armed forces. That is, provided that the injury or illness renders the family member medically unfit to perform the duties of the member’s office, grade, rank or rating.

Eligible employees also are entitled to leave because of a qualifying situation caused by a covered family member’s active duty or call to active duty in the armed forces in support of a contingency operation plan.

Half the price, twice the services

When Central PA District Business Development Team member Heather Dockey followed up on a sales lead with the Pennsylvania Coalition Against Domestic Violence, she noticed overnight packages waiting for a competitor to pick up. Curious, Dockey asked Director Cindy Leedom what they paid for the service and was shocked to learn the nonprofit was paying twice what USPS would charge.

Dockey asked the manager if she wouldn’t prefer to use those additional funds to support the coalition’s outreach efforts. Leedom agreed. The company switched to Express Mail on the spot. “Every penny counts in our work,” Leedom said. “So the savings Heather identified for us are making a tremendous impact in our communities.”

The nonprofit group was so impressed with the overnight service they received from USPS that they invited Heather back to give them USPS.com training on all USPS products and services. Now, they use Click-N-Ship and other USPS online services to make their office run even smoother.

Postal news

Mail volume was down 3 percent, or 1.7 billion pieces, for the first quarter of fiscal year 2008, according to preliminary financial results presented recently to the Postal Service Board of Governors.

First-Class Mail volume decreased 3.9 percent and Standard Mail volume decreased 2.6 percent in the quarter ending December 31, 2007.

National on-time performance scores for the delivery of First-Class Mail hit all-time first-quarter highs in two of the three categories the Postal Service tracks. National overnight service was 96 percent on-time — a first for three quarters in a row. Two-day service was 93 percent on-time. Three-day performance was 88 percent, a two-point improvement over the same period last year.

Philadelphia attorney Alan Kessler was elected chairman of the Postal Service Board of Governors, and Austin, TX, businesswoman Carolyn Lewis Gallagher was elected vice chairman during the recent Board meeting.

New Priority Mail and Express Mail Shipping Initiatives Field Information Kit

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Introduction

On January 17, 2008, the Postal Service™ announced two new shipping initiatives — a larger Priority Mail® Flat-Rate Box with new domestic and international pricing, including a military discount, and an Express Mail® Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium. Both initiatives take effect March 3, 2008.

The new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box enables customers to ship 50 percent more than the current box. The box may be used for either domestic or international shipments. The box is offered at a \$2.00 discount if shipped to overseas military addresses — i.e., to Army Post Office or Fleet Post Office (APO/FPO) addresses.

Note: There are two versions of the flat-rate box: the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box and the APO/FPO Flat-Rate Box. Both are acceptable for domestic shipments, but it is intended that the APO/FPO Box be used for APO/FPO addresses. The APO/FPO Box should *not* be promoted for domestic use. It is *not* intended for international shipments.

Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box Prices

- Domestic Shipping: \$12.95
- Military Shipping (APO/FPO Addresses): \$10.95
- International Shipping:
 - Canada and Mexico: \$29.95
 - Other Countries: \$49.95

The Postal Service will continue to offer its original Priority Mail Flat-Rate Boxes, which currently retail domestically for \$8.95 and internationally for \$23.00 to Canada and Mexico, and \$37.00 to other countries.

The new Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium offers the option of Express Mail delivery on Sundays and federal holidays for an additional \$12.50. A customer who wants a lower-cost alternative may choose to have the package delivered on the next business day at the regular Express Mail price.

The new mailing standards for the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box and the Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium will be incorporated as revisions to *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) and *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®). The complete text of the revisions is scheduled to be published in the February 28, 2008, edition of the *Postal Bulletin*.

Fact Sheet: Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box

- A new, larger flat-rate box will be made available to Priority Mail customers for domestic and international shipping.
- A special version of the box, the Priority Mail APO/FPO Flat-Rate Box, featuring the *America Supports You* logo is available for customers shipping to military service men and women at APO/FPO addresses.

Note: The APO/FPO Flat-Rate Box is intended for use only to APO/FPO addresses; however, retail employees will not refuse these boxes if presented at retail for non-APO/FPO addresses.

Benefits

- The Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box provides an additional option for customers who want to take advantage of Priority Mail flat-rate pricing.
- The same box can be used for either domestic or international shipments.
- Customers shipping the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box or the specially designed APO/FPO version to APO/FPO ZIP Codes™ will pay \$2.00 less.
- The new box is not subject to surcharges, and it can be combined with USPS.com online services like free package pickup.

- If postage is purchased through PC Postage[®] channels, Delivery Confirmation[™] service is free.
- The new box is ecofriendly and has received Cradle to Cradle Certification. This independent certification is awarded to products that use ecologically intelligent design that eliminates the concept of waste.

Size

12 inches x 12 inches x 5-1/2 inches (50 percent more capacity than the current flat-rate box).

Prices

- Domestic shipments using the new box are priced at \$12.95.
- Shipments to APO/FPO addresses using the new box are priced at \$10.95.
- Shipments to Canada and Mexico using the new box are priced at \$29.95.
- International shipments to the rest of the world using the new box are priced at \$49.95.

Effective Date

On March 3, 2008, customers can begin sending the new boxes at the above prices.

Customers may order boxes from The Postal Store[®], at www.usps.com, and by calling 800-610-8734 beginning February 20, 2008, but shipping at the new rates cannot begin until March 3, 2008.

Fact Sheet: Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium

- Only Express Mail shipments designated and charged for Sunday/Holiday Delivery will be delivered on those days.

Benefits

- Customers may select either Sunday/Holiday Delivery at the premium price or next-business-day delivery at the Monday-through-Saturday price.
- These options are available at retail and alternate access channels — e.g., Click-N-Ship[®] service, WebTools, Automated Postal Centers[®] (APCs[®]), contract postal units (CPUs), and PC Postage[®] providers.
- Express Mail Corporate Account customers can charge postage and fees to one central account. Customers may deposit Express Mail shipments paid through a corporate account at any Express Mail collection box, at a Post Office[™], or with a Postal Service carrier.
- Nothing will change for manifest mailers — Express Mail manifest items will be delivered on Sundays and holidays, if available, for delivery with no premium.

- Rules for waiver-of-signature delivery option apply to Sunday/Holiday deliveries.

Price

The premium for guaranteed Sunday/Holiday Delivery is \$12.50 in addition to the cost of the Express Mail service.

Sticker

A special yellow-and-white “Sunday/Holiday” sticker (Label 25) will be applied to all Sunday/Holiday Delivery packages during retail transactions. Electronically generated Express Mail labels will contain the text Sunday/Holiday Delivery Guaranteed. Label 25 will also be added to these items at acceptance when possible. The sticker is 3-1/2 inches x 3 inches.

Effective Date

On March 3, 2008, the new Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium goes into effect for packages guaranteed for Sunday/Holiday Delivery after this date.

Talking Points: Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box

The new, larger box enables customers to ship 50 percent more than the current box. There will be a special version of the box for the military, and there is a \$2.00 discount when either box is shipped to an APO/FPO address.

Note: There are two versions of the flat-rate box: the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box and the APO/FPO Flat-Rate Box. Both are acceptable for domestic shipments, but it is intended that the APO/FPO Box be used for APO/FPO addresses. However, retail employees will not refuse these boxes if presented at retail counters for non-APO/FPO addresses.

Here are some features of the new box:

- The box may be used for either domestic or international shipments:
 - Domestic shipments using the new box are priced at \$12.95.
 - Shipments to APO/FPO addresses using the new box are priced at \$10.95.
 - Shipments to Canada and Mexico using the new box are priced at \$29.95.
 - International shipments to the rest of the world using the new box are priced at \$49.95.
- A 5-percent discount applies for international shipments when postage is purchased online.
- There is a 70-pound weight limit to domestic addresses. There is a 20-pound weight limit on shipments to international destinations.

The original Priority Mail Flat-Rate Boxes priced at \$8.95 (domestic) and internationally for \$23.00 to Canada and

Mexico, and \$37.00 to other countries will continue to be offered.

Customers may order boxes from The Postal Store, at www.usps.com, and by calling 800-610-8734 beginning February 20, 2008, but shipping at the new rates cannot begin until March 3, 2008.

Talking Points: Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium

Express Mail service is the only overnight product in the market with a delivery option offered 7 days a week. It is accepted at more than 37,000 retail locations nationwide.

Below are some points to keep in mind when discussing the premium with customers:

- The \$12.50 premium is to cover our costs for delivering on days when Post Offices are usually closed.
- The Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery option will be available through Click-N-Ship service, WebTools, APCs, CPUs, and PC Postage providers.
- For purposes of comparison, the Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium is equal to what our competitors charge for Saturday delivery. The Postal Service does not charge extra to deliver on Saturday.
- Each shipment will be identified with a special yellow-and-white “Sunday/Holiday” sticker (Label 25), which will be applied at the point of acceptance.
- Electronically generated labels will contain the text “Sunday/Holiday Delivery Guaranteed.”
- Customers with an Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA) may charge postage and fees for Express Mail shipments — both domestic and international — to one central account. Customers may deposit Express Mail shipments paid through a corporate account at any Express Mail collection box, at a Post Office, or with a Postal Service letter carrier.
- A customer whose Express Mail shipment would arrive on a Sunday or a holiday — and who wants a lower-cost option — can choose to have the shipment delivered on Monday or the next business day after the holiday at the regular Express Mail price.
- Express Mail International® items received from other countries will be delivered on Monday or the next business day after the holiday.
- Postal Service personnel should avoid referring to the premium as a “surcharge.”

- The premium will be applicable to pieces guaranteed for Sunday/Holiday Delivery beginning March 3, 2008.

Distribution Plan/Ordering Instructions for Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box



Shipments to offshore Post Offices began February 4, 2008.

From February 11–15, 2008, automatic distribution of the boxes to all offices will include the following:

- 50 standard boxes (for domestic and international shipping) to large offices.
- 25 standard boxes (for domestic and international shipping) to small offices.
- 50 APO/FPO boxes to 50 select offices.

Offices should expect to receive their allotments 7–10 business days after shipment begins.

Note: Offices responsible for contract postal units (CPUs) will need to order an assortment of these boxes for their CPUs so that they are available in the CPU location before the March 3, 2008, effective date.

Once the automatic distribution has been completed, offices can order additional quantities from the Material Distribution Center (MDC) by using touch-tone order entry (TTOE): Call 800-273-1509.

Note: You must be registered to use TTOE. To register, call 800-332-0317, option 1, extension 2925, and follow the prompts to leave a message. (Wait 48 hours after registering before placing your first order.) For complete TTOE ordering instructions, visit the Materials Customer Service Web site at http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/_doc/ops_ttoeins.doc or call National Materials Customer Service at 800-332-0317, option 2.

Distribution Plan/Ordering Instructions for Label 25



Automatic distribution of Label 25, *Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery Guaranteed*, will begin to all offices on February 20, 2008. The shipment will consist of one roll of 250 stickers for each office.

Note: Offices that are responsible for contract postal units (CPUs) should ensure that all CPUs have an adequate supply of this sticker prior to the March 3, 2008, effective date.

Once the automatic distribution has been completed, offices can order additional quantities from the MDC by using touch-tone order entry (TTOE): Call 800-273-1509.

Note: You must be registered to use TTOE. To register, call 800-332-0317, option 1, extension 2925, and follow the prompts to leave a message. (Wait 48 hours after registering before placing your first order.) Standup Talks for Retail Employees

Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box

On March 3, the Postal Service will introduce a new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box designed to meet the needs of customers for a cost-effective means of shipping larger items than the current flat-rate box allows. The new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box is 12 inches x 12 inches x 5-1/2 inches, offering 50 percent more capacity than the current flat-rate box. The new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Boxes can be used for either domestic or international shipments. There is also a special version of the box that includes the *America Supports You* emblem to show support for our troops. There is a \$2.00 discount when either version of the box is shipped to an APO/FPO address. The flat-rate price is based on the destination, as follows:

- The domestic destination price will be \$12.95.
- The APO/FPO destination price will be \$10.95.
- International destinations will have two prices:
 - Canada and Mexico will be \$29.95.
 - Other countries will be \$49.95.

Note: The APO/FPO box is acceptable for domestic shipments, but it is intended for use only to APO/FPO addresses. It should *not* be promoted for domestic use. It is *not* intended for international shipments.

The new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box is not subject to dimensional weight or balloon-weight pricing, incurs no fuel fees or surcharges, and can be combined with USPS.com online services like free package pickup. If postage is purchased online, Delivery Confirmation service is free. All USPS packaging has been independently certified for ecofriendly design.

Retail associates utilizing retail equipment will determine the rate based on the box and destination ZIP Code entered into the Point of Service (POS) or Integrated Retail Terminal (IRT) system. Remember: Only Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Boxes *destined for APO/FPO ZIP Codes* receive the \$10.95 price.

The same new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box can be used for either domestic or international shipments. Like other Priority Mail International® options, the Priority Mail

Large Flat-Rate Box offers a 5-percent online discount. There is also a 20-pound international weight limit.

Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium

Beginning March 3, the Postal Service will charge a premium for Express Mail delivery on Sundays and holidays. The premium will be \$12.50. That's in addition to the regular Express Mail price. Our competitors charge a rate equal to this amount for *Saturday* delivery.

The Postal Service is the only shipping company that delivers 7 days a week. To leverage this advantage, and as part of a larger effort to increase market share and profitability of Express Mail, the Postal Service will charge, beginning on March 3, a new Sunday and holiday Express Mail delivery premium of \$12.50. The premium will be charged when customers want Express Mail for delivery on Sundays and federal holidays.

The premium for Sunday/Holiday Delivery is intended to recover the cost of delivering on days when Post Offices are usually closed.

A customer whose Express Mail shipment would arrive on a Sunday or holiday — and who wants a lower-cost option — can choose to have the package delivered on Monday or the next business day after the holiday at the regular Express Mail price. Express Mail International items received from other countries will be delivered on Monday or the next business day after the holiday.

Current rules for the waiver-of-signature delivery option shipments will apply to all Express Mail shipments including Sunday/Holiday Delivery. The Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery option will also be available to customers through alternate access channels like Click-N-Ship service, Shipping Assistant, WebTools, APCs, contract postal units (CPUs), and authorized PC Postage vendors.

Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery is offered at a competitive price. For many of our customers, Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery service is uniquely qualified to meet their business or personal commitments. It is a value-added service designed to meet customer needs when it definitely has to be delivered on a Sunday or holiday.

Retail associates should explain to customers who have this need: "For a small fee, the Postal Service can guarantee that your package is delivered on ____."

Retail associates will need to apply Label 25, the new yellow-and-white Express Mail Sunday/Holiday sticker, to all Sunday/Holiday Delivery Express Mail packages accepted at retail counters.

The new Sunday/Holiday Express Mail sticker measures 3-1/2 inches x 3 inches, and a roll of 250 stickers will be distributed to all Post Offices prior to launch. Offices will be able to order additional stickers through eBuy. Offices without eBuy access will have to reorder through the MDC.

Standup Talk for Letter Carriers

Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery

Beginning March 3, the Postal Service will charge a premium price for Express Mail delivery on Sundays and holidays. The premium will be \$12.50. That's in addition to the regular Express Mail price. To put that in perspective, our competitors charge a rate equal to this amount for *Saturday* delivery, a day when we deliver at regular prices.

To ensure customer satisfaction and maintain our pricing strategies, *only* Express Mail items committed for Sunday or holiday delivery should be delivered on those days. Label 25, the new yellow-and-white Express Mail Sunday/Holiday sticker, should be applied to all Express Mail items that have been sold at retail counters. Label 25 is available at each retail unit. Every retail unit will receive a roll of 250 labels prior to the March 3 implementation date. Additional labels may be ordered from the MDC (see the ordering information that appears earlier in this article).

Customers using Automated Postal Centers (APCs) or who use Click-N-Ship service to purchase Sunday/Holiday Express Mail service will be able to obtain designation of the service electronically on their mailpieces.

It is important that all Express Mail items receive the appropriate scans of the barcode on the Express Mail label. Express Mail pieces picked up from customers or collection boxes and brought back to the delivery unit *are not* officially in the system until the acceptance scan takes place.

Carriers scheduled for delivery of Sunday/Holiday Express Mail should deliver only Express Mail items that have the following identifier or marking on the mailpiece:

- Label 25, a special yellow-and-white sticker that is applied to all Express Mail shipments received through retail acceptance.
- Labels produced online through Click-N-Ship service, through PC Postage vendors, or on the APC and that contain the text "Sunday/Holiday Delivery Guaranteed."
- Express Mail manifest pieces with label numbers beginning "EA" or "ES." These items might not have Label 25 on them, but they must still be delivered on Sundays and holidays if available.

Express Mail Corporate Account customers should receive Sunday or holiday delivery unless the "No Holiday Box" is checked on the label. Express Mail Corporate Account holders will be charged the premium for Sunday/Holiday guaranteed service if the item is available for Sunday or holiday delivery and the "No Holiday" box has not been checked.

Express Mail International items should not be delivered on Sundays or holidays. Express Mail International items are delivered only on regular delivery days.

Standup Talk for All Employees (Except Retail Employees and Letter Carriers)

Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium

Beginning March 3, the Postal Service will charge a premium for Express Mail delivery on Sundays and holidays. The premium will be \$12.50 in addition to the regular Express Mail price. Our competitors charge a rate equal to this amount for *Saturday* delivery.

The Postal Service is the only shipping company that delivers 7 days a week. To leverage this advantage, and as part of a larger effort to increase market share and profitability of Express Mail, the Postal Service will charge a new Sunday and holiday Express Mail delivery premium of \$12.50. The premium will be charged when customers want Express Mail for delivery on Sundays and federal holidays.

A customer whose Express Mail shipment would arrive on a Sunday or holiday — and who wants a lower-cost option — can choose to have the package delivered on Monday or the next business day after the holiday at the regular Express Mail price. Express Mail International items received from other countries will be delivered on Monday or the next business day after the holiday.

Current rules for the waiver-of-signature delivery option shipments will apply to all Express Mail shipments including Sunday/Holiday Delivery. The Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery option will also be available to customers through alternate access channels like Click-N-Ship service, Shipping Assistant, WebTools, APCs, contract postal units (CPUs), and authorized PC Postage vendors.

Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery pieces will be identified by Label 25, the new yellow-and-white Express Mail Sunday/Holiday sticker. This label will be applied at the retail counter. All Post Offices will receive a roll of 250 of the labels prior to launch. Offices will be able to order additional label quantities through eBuy or through the MDC.

Frequently Asked Questions

Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box

Q. Why do we need a larger Priority Mail Flat-Rate Box?

A. The new box will allow shippers of smaller items to consolidate shipments on multiple orders to save money and build customer loyalty.

Q. What are the dimensions of the new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box?

A. The new box has inner dimensions of 12 inches x 12 inches x 5-1/2 inches and has 50 percent more capacity than the current flat-rate box offering.

Q. Can the new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box be used to ship to international destinations?

A. Yes. The new box may also be used for Priority Mail International™ shipments. There is one flat-rate price for Canada and Mexico (\$29.95) and one flat-rate price for all other countries (\$49.95). There is also a 20-pound weight limit for international shipments.

Q. Does the new box still qualify for the 5-percent Priority Mail International discount when postage is paid for online using Click-N-Ship service or through an authorized PC Postage provider?

A. Yes. If postage is paid using Click-N-Ship service or through an authorized PC Postage provider, the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box will receive the 5-percent discount for international destinations, just like all other Priority Mail International shipments where postage is paid online.

Q. How will the retail clerk know which price to charge when a customer presents a Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box at the retail counter?

A. The price will be selected from the Point of Service (POS) terminal based on the box and the destination ZIP Code.

Q. Since the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box is larger than any other expedited packaging offered, does this mean it may be subject to dimensional or balloon-rate pricing?

A. No. The Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box will not be subject to dimensional-weight or balloon-rate charges.

Q. Is there a weight limit on the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box?

A. There is a 70-pound weight limit for domestic destinations. There is a 20-pound weight limit for the box addressed to international destinations. Other restrictions for APO/FPO addresses might apply — see the article titled “Overseas Military Mail” published in each issue of the *Postal Bulletin*.

Q. Can a customer use the free package pickup option on USPS.com for the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box?

A. Yes. Customers may schedule a free package pickup for this product.

Q. Are customers required to use the Priority Mail APO/FPO Flat-Rate Box to get the reduced military price?

A. No. The regular Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box, the Priority Mail APO/FPO Flat-Rate Box, or a customized version of the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box, will qualify for the reduced military price when shipped to an APO/FPO address.

- Q. Will customers obtain the lower price for APO/FPO addresses if they use Click-N-Ship service or other online postage methods?
- A. Yes. The special APO/FPO price will be available through all PC Postage channels including Click-N-Ship service.
- Q. For the new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box, how will employees know if the correct rate is paid when a customer uses “nondenominated” or hidden postage?
- A. The printed label will include the text “LG FLAT RATE BOX.”
- Q. Where can customers order the new box?
- A. Customers may order the new box at www.usps.com; under “Shipping Tools,” click on Supplies. You can also order boxes by calling 800-610-8734, and asking for an operator. The boxes are free, available in packs of 10 or 25, and will be delivered right to the customer’s home or business. Boxes will be available for order beginning February 20, 2008. However, the prices for the box will not be available until March 3, 2008.
- Q. Since the boxes will be available to be ordered on February 20, 2008, can customers use the box before March 3, 2008?
- A. Yes. However, they will be charged the zoned/weighted Priority Mail rate. The prices for the new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box and the Priority Mail APO/FPO Flat-Rate Box go into effect March 3, 2008.
- Q. Why is there a separate price for APO/FPO addresses when they are considered domestic addresses?
- A. The lower price — a discount for shipping to APO/FPO addresses — shows support for our troops, making it more cost-effective to send needed items.
- Q. Delivery Confirmation service is free when Priority Mail service is paid for online, and when the label is printed online and paid for at the full-service counter. Is that changing?
- A. In the very near future the Postal Service will no longer offer the option to generate online labels that are also not paid for online.
- Q. Does the Postal Service charge \$2.00 Postage Due when an addressee at an APO/FPO address has moved to a non-APO/FPO address when the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box is used?
- A. Yes.

Express Mail Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium

- Q. Will Sunday/Holiday Delivery of Express Mail items be to every ZIP Code?
- A. No. Sunday/Holiday Delivery is available only to destination ZIP Codes that are on the Sunday/Holiday Delivery list. The ZIP Codes are programmed into the retail and online systems.
- Q. How will Label 25 for the Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium be applied at Automated Postal Centers (APCs)?
- A. Labels produced online or at the APC will contain text saying “Sunday/Holiday Delivery Guaranteed” on the single-ply label. Retail associates will also place Label 25 on these items during the acceptance process, if possible.
- Q. What policies are in place for small offices that do not have Sunday/Holiday Delivery?
- A. Only offices that are designated Sunday/Holiday Delivery ZIP Codes will have delivery on Sundays and holidays, just as it is today. So retail offices, as well as online and APCs, will not sell the Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium on pieces destinating to offices not on the list.
- Q. Will contract stations be a part of the automatic distribution for the Express Mail Sunday/Holiday sticker (Label 25) or will the contracting officer representatives (CORs) need to order the stickers for them?
- A. Most contract postal units (CPUs) will receive the Express Mail Sunday/Holiday sticker in the initial distribution scheduled to begin February 20, 2008.
- Q. Will there be any change to handling second delivery attempts on Express Mail when the second attempt falls on a Sunday or a holiday?
- A. Items with a first attempt on a normal business day, such as Saturday, will not be taken out for a second attempt on a Sunday or a holiday.
- Q. Are Express Mail International items received for delivery from other countries eligible for Sunday/Holiday Delivery?
- A. No. Inbound Express Mail International items are not to be delivered on Sundays or holidays. All inbound Express Mail International items are to be delivered on normal delivery days only. The reporting systems will be adjusted to reflect the normal delivery day as the scheduled delivery date.
- Q. Will an Express Mail item that is scheduled for Monday or next normal business day delivery but that

is available for delivery on a Sunday or a holiday be taken out for delivery?

- A. No. Only Express Mail items that have premium rate postage, and Express Mail manifest items, are to be taken out for delivery on a Sunday or a holiday. No exceptions. Failure to comply will greatly reduce the value of the Sunday/Holiday Delivery Premium offering.
- Q. If an Express Mail item is scheduled for delivery on a day preceding a Sunday or a holiday but is inadvertently delayed and does not reach the delivery unit until a Sunday or a holiday, should the item be delivered on a Sunday or a holiday, or should it be held for the next regular delivery day?
- A. If the item received on a Sunday or a holiday has been delayed and is available for delivery, the Postal Service will attempt delivery on the Sunday or holiday to the ZIP Codes on the Sunday/Holiday Delivery ZIP Code list at no extra cost to the mailer.

Media Kit: Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box

Overview

Flat-rate boxes for Express Mail and Priority Mail services have enjoyed growing popularity. Sales of the 3-year-old Priority Mail Flat-Rate Boxes recently reached \$1 billion. To provide customers with an additional option, the Postal Service has responded with the new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box that is 50 percent larger than the current box.

In addition, the Postal Service is offering a \$2.00 "military discount" when the new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box is sent to an APO/FPO address. The Postal Service has also produced a special edition of the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box that is cobranded with the *America Supports You* logo, representing the Department of Defense program that is designed to assist the American public in showing its support for our nation's troops. The specially branded box is not required to earn the APO/FPO discount. The discount is applied automatically based on the APO/FPO address when either version of the box is used.

As with all flat-rate packaging, customers may mail as much as they can fit in a package — without distorting its dimensions, and up to a 70-pound limit — all at the same low price. It's Quick, Easy, Convenient[®]. That's Today's Mail[®]!

The new flexibility provided by the Postal Law of 2006 has allowed the Postal Service to introduce these new initiatives rapidly.

Media Strategy

This is a *bona fide* news story. The \$2.00 military discount is a first of its kind; in fact, it is historic. Although less "earth-shaking," the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box is also new, and it provides a mailing option that many customers have been seeking. In view of the strong news angle, there is a good chance to gain positive media coverage simply by making the local media aware that these new options will be available starting on March 3, 2008.

There is also a high likelihood that media attention can be generated through successful public relations involving local mailing efforts by local groups that arrange mailings to the troops and acquire the goods to be mailed.

We believe that local postmasters and their service teams are in the best position to know who in their communities are doing these types of mailings. In fact, these groups probably look to the Postal Service and its employees as a trusted partner. Now is an excellent time to help these groups gain added media coverage while also publicizing our new services and our corporate citizenship in providing a postage discount to support our troops.

Possible media outreach activities include the following:

- A press conference or media interview that includes one or more of the associated mailing groups.
- Photo opportunities with those who conduct the first mailings at the new discounted rates or very large mailings (perhaps at a large cumulative postage savings).
- A lobby event to announce the new discount and service and show off the free packaging.

Don't forget to alert large-volume customers to order the new packaging early, because it can take 7–10 days to fulfill an order for the free packaging, and we expect that our customers will want to take advantage of the new discount and the larger free packaging as soon as possible.

Good News in Action

Here's an example of the kinds of stories that we have been seeing that result from public-spirited efforts to support our troops through the use of the mail. The following is reprinted from the January 28, 2008, Postal News Link. They love our current flat-rate service. Just think how they'll react to the convenience of the larger box and a large postage discount to go with it!

Sales of Priority Mail Flat-Rate Boxes reach milestone

(Picture cut-line: "Operation Shoebox New Jersey volunteers ready Priority Mail Flat-Rate Boxes for shipping. Sales of Priority Mail Flat-Rate Boxes — if it fits, it ships for one low price — have reached \$1 billion since introduction of the product three years ago.")

Executives at Operation Shoebox New Jersey (OSNJ, <http://www.opshoeboxnj.org/>), a non profit organization (headquartered in Hillsborough, NJ) that uses flat-rate boxes to ship care packages to service members deployed overseas, said they appreciate their value and convenience.

"Knowing up front what the shipping cost will be is a great way to manage expenses," OSNJ founder and Executive Director Rod Hirsch said. "And with the low price, we can send more packages overseas."

Environmentally conscious customers also like the product. Priority Mail and Express Mail packaging was awarded Cradle to Cradle Certification for their environmental attributes last June. USPS was the first and only company in its industry to receive this certification.

Already a popular product with customers, the flat-rate boxes are about to get even better. Beginning March 3, the Postal Service will add a new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box to its product offerings. The new box will allow customers to ship 50 percent more than with the current flat-rate box. In addition, it will be offered at a \$2 discount to overseas military addresses — a postal first for the armed forces.

How to Run an Event

We know that local postmasters, customer relations coordinators, and field public affairs professionals know how to conduct outreach in their local communities. From open houses and customer appreciation events, to eBay and USPS.com days, to passport fairs, to special programs to celebrate stamps issuances, to public service initiatives like Consumer Protection Week, Postal Service employees are experts at getting the word out and delivering results.

In this case, we believe we have a vehicle that can deliver a total return in terms of growing our business, building our brand, serving our customers, and supporting our communities. And there are many potential partners

who could benefit from the effort and should be willing to join us. So our only advice in this case is: if you have the time and resources, now is the time to take advantage of the news value inherent in our March 3 launch and the local "firsts" that will take place as customers take advantage of what we are offering.

Talking and Message Points: Parcels for the Troops and the New Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box

- As of March 3, 2008, the Postal Service will offer a new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box, which holds 50 percent more than other flat-rate boxes, and it will also offer our *first-ever postage discount* for mailing these boxes to APO/FPO addresses.
- Customers will receive a \$2.00 discount when they mail the new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box to an APO/FPO address. The \$10.95 flat rate for APO/FPO addresses applies no matter the weight of the contents, up to a 70-pound limit. This compares to a price of \$12.95 for mailing the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box domestically.
- Flat-rate boxes are available free of charge and can be ordered online at www.usps.com — under "Shipping Tools," click on Supplies — or by calling 800-610-8734, and asking for an operator.
- Customers also have a choice of two exterior designs with the new Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box. One box features the standard Postal Service logo. The other box also includes a distinctive *America Supports You* logo for customers who want to add a special message on the outside of the box to go with the special contents they are sending on the inside.
- *America Supports You* is a program of the Department of Defense designed to assist Americans in showing their support for our troops.
- The new discount is not tied to the logo. The APO/FPO discount applies to both the regular and the APO/FPO Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Boxes so long as they are addressed to an APO/FPO address. The lower price will be applied automatically through POS, based on the destination address.
- Pricing for the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box is as follows: \$10.95 to APO/FPO addresses; \$12.95 to domestic addresses; \$29.95 to Canada or Mexico; and \$49.95 to the rest of the world.
- Local Post Office retail associates can provide customs and mailing guidelines for all international addresses.
- As one of our nation's oldest public service institutions, and the employer of more than 180,000 military

veterans, the Postal Service is proud to offer these new services and to support our troops with this historic new discount and the cobranded *America Supports You* box.

- Remember, the employees of the Postal Service are here to support you. And we are very pleased to provide you with these new services so that you may support the ones you love.

Suggested Event Remarks

In both cases, we are talking about flat rates. Flat rates mean you can mail as much as you want — as long as it fits in the box without distorting its dimensions and adheres to a 70-pound limit — all at one low price. And if you are mailing the Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Box to an APO or FPO address, you will receive a \$2.00 dollar discount off the regular price.

This discount is a first for the Postal Service. We have never done it before because we never had the freedom to do it. Now we do, thanks to the new law. And we are using that freedom to help the citizens of America show their support for our sons and daughters, our husbands and wives, our friends and loved ones who are serving our country in the military around the world.

In addition, to mark this historic occasion, the Postal Service has produced a specially branded box for mailing to the military. The box is cobranded by *America Supports You*. *America Supports You* is an official Department of Defense program that lets citizens show their support for our nation's armed forces.

It is not necessary to use the branded box to mail at a discount. Either of the two Priority Mail Large Flat-Rate Boxes will receive the discount if they are mailed to an APO or FPO address. But we know that Americans like to show their pride for the outstanding job our military is doing. So we are proud to provide this uniquely branded box for

those who want to send a special message along with their special package.

The Postal Service is also very proud to offer this historic postage discount in support of our troops and those who support our troops. And we are pleased to provide even greater convenience and choice for the millions of Americans who rely on the ease and simplicity of flat-rate Priority Mail service. This is the beginning of a new era. This is Today's Mail. Thank you.

Questions

Q. How do I get supplies?

- A. Priority Mail boxes are free and can be ordered at www.usps.com — under "Shipping Tools," click on *Supplies*. You can also order boxes by calling 800-610-8734, and asking for an operator.

Q. Is the packaging environmentally safe?

- A. Packages are 100 percent recyclable and exceed all Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) environmental standards. In fact, Express Mail and Priority Mail packaging have been awarded Cradle to Cradle Certification for their environmental attributes. The Postal Service is committed to finding new ways to protect the environment and is the first in its industry to receive this certification. Decals, labels, tapes, and adhesives from the Postal Service are recyclable, too.

Q. How long will it take to get my free packaging?

- A. Orders are fulfilled within 7–10 business days. Boxes will be available for order beginning February 20, 2008. However, the prices for the box will not be available until March 3, 2008.

Q. How long does it take a Priority Mail item to get where it is going?

- A. It takes an average of 2–3 days for a Priority Mail item to reach any destination in the United States. For Priority Mail items addressed to APO/FPO locations, delivery times vary by destination and current conditions in the local area. Military officials advise, "At the gateway, mail is sorted, bagged, and tagged to arrive at a military postal unit overseas. While commercial aircraft are very consistent, there could be a large variation in transit."

Q. What special military mail services are generally available?

- A. Most USPS special services, such as Certified Mail™, Registered Mail™, insured mail, certificate of mailing, return receipt, restricted delivery, and return receipt for merchandise are available in the military postal service. Collect on delivery (COD) and Delivery Confirmation services are not available.

America Supports You is a Department of Defense program that provides opportunities for citizens to show their support for the U.S. armed forces. The program was launched in 2004 to highlight citizen support for our military men and women and communicate that support to the members of our armed forces at home and abroad. *America Supports You* connects individuals, organizations, and companies to hundreds of home-front groups offering a variety of support to the military community. The program also connects military service members and their families to home-front groups that provide assistance. *America Supports You* home-front groups show support in many ways including writing letters and e-mails, sending care packages, offering scholarships, and helping the wounded when they return home.

DMM Revision: Products Mailable at Nonprofit Standard Mail Rates

Effective January 1, 2008, the Postal Service™ is revising 703.1.6.11 of the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) to reflect the change in the maximum value of a nonprofit low-cost item to \$9.10.

Under statutory restrictions in DMM 703, products that are mailed at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates must meet at least one of three exceptions. A *low-cost item* is one of the exceptions referenced in the Internal Revenue Code. The value of a low-cost item — the actual cost to the authorized nonprofit organization — is determined each year by the Internal Revenue Service, adjusted for the cost of living.



Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changed.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Place Liquids in sealed, leak-proof containers and cushioned in material sufficient to absorb all leakage. Packages must be marked as containing liquids.

Place Powders in sift-proof packaging to prevent any leakage.

Mail Perishables only if they can reach their destination in good condition and are packaged to protect and secure the contents.



Fragile Items

Place glass, fine china and other fragile items in packaging cushioned to prevent breakage during transport.



Hazardous Materials

Few hazardous materials are permitted in the mail. Those permitted are subject to specific labeling, packaging, and quantity requirements.



Prohibited Materials





Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Post Offices, classified stations, branches, and contract postal units may display this poster at their option. If the poster is displayed, it should be placed on the community bulletin board located in the Post Office™ box lobby and not in the main retail (full service) lobby. Alternatively, Missing Children posters can be maintained in a binder behind the counter to be used as a reference guide. The posters also may be posted in a prominent location where letter carriers will be able to see them before or after they go out of their routes. Making this information available to letter carriers is consistent with the NALC/USPS Child Alert Program to facilitate identification of missing children.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information periodically. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators via e-mail addresses provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of an e-mailed Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all Postal Service™ facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed as noted above for 30 days unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The e-mail network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service® only as described above. If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 800-843-5678.

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

Customer Change-of-Address Move Validation Letter Procedures

The move validation letter (MVL) was implemented in 1996 to help validate change-of-address orders (COAs) and to provide increased protection for customers filing COAs. MVLs are sent as First-Class Mail® items and should always be delivered as addressed based on the “Or Current Resident” endorsement.

MVLs must be delivered as addressed, even though the person (or family) named on the MVL has moved, and even if the address appears to be vacant. Only if the piece is refused, the address is not valid, or the address no longer exists should the piece be returned.

Returned MVLs should be directed to the Processing and Distribution Center (P&DC) to be processed on Postal Automated Redirection System (PARS) equipment. Mail should be individually endorsed to show the reason for nondelivery (refused, no such address, etc.), or separated

by reason for nondelivery, bundled with the top piece endorsed and placed in the throwback case.

The MVL has also been revised to show information on the outside envelope for the addressee, the new (current) resident(s) at the address, and the carrier.

Area vice presidents and district managers are asked to be sure that all MVLs received in Post Offices™ under their area and district are delivered to the address on the piece, and that all carriers delivering to street addresses and employees delivering P.O. box mail are aware of these requirements. When reviewing operations at Post Offices under a jurisdiction, also review the handling of MVLs for compliance with these requirements.

Domestic Mail

Get the Right Postage

Verifying that each piece of mail has the correct amount of postage is one important element in ensuring the financial success of the Postal Service™, and all employees must play a role in helping the Postal Service collect the proper revenue.

For mail accepted at the retail counter or through the business mail entry unit, proper revenue collection generally is not a concern because retail and acceptance personnel are trained to check for correct postage payment. However, mailpieces that are deposited in collection boxes might not be routinely checked for postage. For example, collection boxes often include pieces that bear Click-N-Ship® labels or metered postage, which includes information-based indicia products (IBIP) and PC Postage® products. Because mailers apply these methods of postage, the amount applied might occasionally be incorrect or, in some cases, missing.

This article provides some tips to help employees identify shortpaid mailpieces found in the mailstream and collect the proper amount of postage. The exhibits show images of various types of postage and describe the action that Postal Service employees should take regarding them.

Click-N-Ship

Customers can print Click-N-Ship labels online at www.usps.com in the versions shown in [Exhibit 1](#) and [Exhibit 2](#).

Metered Postage

Imprints for metered postage have different formats depending on the authorized meter vendors. [Exhibit 3](#) shows some examples of imprint design for metered postage.

Information-Based Indicia Products (IBIP)


The postage on IBIP mailpieces has different formats. [Exhibit 4](#) shows two examples of IBIP postage.

PC Postage Products

The indicia for PC Postage products have different formats. These labels may be printed with or without the postage amount in human-readable characters. [Exhibit 5](#) shows examples of the postage amount with human-readable characters.

[Exhibit 6](#) shows three examples in which the actual postage amount is not in human-readable characters, so conventional visual postage verification is not possible. However, the text of such indicia normally shows the following information: Mail class, shipped-from ZIP Code™, weight, and any appropriate surcharge applied. In addition, the indicia area might also show zones. These indicia are permitted only on the following types of mail: Express Mail® items (international or domestic), Priority Mail® items with Delivery Confirmation™ service, and Package Services items with Delivery Confirmation service.


Exhibit 1: Click-N-Ship Label With Postage


Exhibit 4: Information-Based Indicia Products (IBIP)


Exhibit 5: PC Postage Products With Human-readable Characters

Postal Service employees should verify that the article matches the description in the text area of the indicia. If the article matches the description, then the correct postage has been paid. If the piece is shortpaid, follow the appropriate shortpaid procedure for the class of mail to collect the postage due.

Human Resources

Service Member Family and Medical Leave

The Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA) now entitles eligible employees to take leave for a covered family member's service in the armed forces. This policy supplements current FMLA policy and provides notice of employee rights to such leave.

Entitlement to Service Member FMLA

Service member FMLA provides eligible employees leave for either or both of the following reasons:

1. To care for a covered family member (i.e., spouse, parent, child, or next of kin) who has incurred an injury or illness in the line of duty while on active duty in the armed forces, provided that such injury or illness may render the family member medically unfit to perform the duties of the member's office, grade, rank, or rating.
2. Because of a qualifying exigency arising out of a covered family member's (i.e., spouse, parent, or child) active duty or call to active duty in the armed forces in support of a contingency operation.

Duration of Service Member FMLA

*When Leave Is to Care for an Injured or Ill Service Member: **Effective immediately***, an eligible employee may take up to 26 work weeks of leave during a single leave year to care for the service member. Leave to care for an injured or ill service member, either by itself or when combined with other FMLA-qualifying leave, may not exceed 26 weeks in a single leave year. *When Leave Is Due to a Qualifying Exigency:* An eligible employee may take up to

12 work weeks of leave during a leave year, in accordance with Department of Labor (DOL) regulations. The right to such leave will take effect **when the DOL regulations are issued**. Employees will be notified when that occurs. Leave due to a qualifying exigency, either by itself or when combined with other FMLA-qualifying leave, may not exceed 12 weeks in a single leave year.

Documentation

For an absence to care for a family member in active duty status who has incurred a serious health condition, medical certification is required to establish that the serious injury or illness was incurred in the line of duty on active duty in the armed forces and may render the service member medically unfit to perform the duties of the member's office, grade, rank, or rating.

For an absence for a qualifying exigency, certification will be required in accordance with pending DOL regulations.

A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of those postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POSTMARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.





How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® Web site at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow

sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark and do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of non-specified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to: Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

New Web-based Driver Observation Training Course for Postmasters, Managers, and Supervisors

This course is free through June 30, 2008. On July 1, 2008, and after, the enrollment fee will be \$15.00. Sign up now and save \$15.00!

Delivery Operations and Safety and Environmental Performance Management are pleased to announce the availability of a new 2-hour, Web-based driver observation training course through the Postal Service™ Automated Enrollment System (AES). The course, Driver Observation Training for Delivery Services (DOT-DS) # 43601-17, was developed through the combined efforts of Delivery Operations, Safety and Environmental Performance Management, Employee Development, and the National Center for Employee Development — Multimedia Resources and Publications.

Enrollment and Fees

Students must enroll through the AES. See “Who can enroll me” on the AES home page at <http://aes.usps.gov>. There is no charge for DOT-DS enrollment before July 1, 2008. On that date and after, the charge will be \$15 per student.

Driver Observations: A Valuable Business Tool

The performance of frequent and high-quality driver observations is one of our most valuable business tools for reducing motor vehicle accidents, injuries, and associated costs.

Course Objectives

The DOT-DS course is designed to provide or enhance the skills of individuals who perform employee driver observations. The course also:

- Promotes standardization of driver observations.
- Encourages maximum use of the driver-observation business tool.
- Aligns with the Postal Service *Strategic Transformation Plan 2006–2010*.

- Coordinates with the Safety and Health Program Evaluation Guide (PEG).

Target Learners

The course is designed for the following target learners:

- Primary
 - Postmasters responsible for delivery services.
 - Managers, Customer Service.
 - Supervisors, Customer Service.
- Secondary
 - Managers, Post Office Operations.
 - Managers, Customer Service Operations.
 - Managers, Safety (area and district).
 - Safety specialists (district).
 - Driving safety instructors.
 - Others who occasionally perform driver observations.

Course Description

The course consists of seven modules with introductory and review materials. The following topics are included:

- What you need to know about safe driving policies.
- How to prepare for a driver observation.
- How to perform a driver observation.
- How to talk with drivers after a driver observation.
- How to document the observation using PS Form 4584, *Observation of Driving Practices*.

The course is computer based. Average completion time during testing was less than 2 hours. The course is designed to be completed in one sitting. Although it may be completed in several sittings, a single sitting provides the optimum learning environment.

Field-Developed DOT Courses

In order to promote standardized training on how driver observations are performed and documented, all field-developed and field-delivered DOT courses are obsolete.

Supply Management

Installation Heads/MAOs: Semiannual Review of Capital Records

Handbook AS-701, *Material Management*, Section 541.28, *Internal Reviews*, contains procedures for conducting a semiannual review of capital records. The procedures require either the installation head or designated material accountability officer (MAO) to conduct a semiannual internal review and an evaluation of the status of property records and files. Installation Heads: If you do not have a designated MAO, refer to Handbook AS-701, Part 541 and Exhibit 541.21, for the assignment procedure and a sample letter of delegation, respectively.

If you are an installation head or a designated MAO, you must complete the review and evaluation process by following these steps:

1. Meet with the designated material accountability assistant (MAA) (if you have one) and discuss the

material accountability background of the installation. If you do not have a designated MAA, refer to Handbook AS-701, Section 541.3 and Exhibit 541.32, for the assignment procedure and a sample letter of delegation, respectively.

2. Review the local standard operating procedures.
3. Randomly select and inventory 10 percent of capital items and 10 percent of sensitive items.
4. Review files and records to verify that they are being maintained in accordance with procedures outlined in Handbook AS-701, Parts 551, 552, 553, and 556.
5. Review the last six property changes for the month to ensure they have been properly verified.

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
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
