

Georgia safety on my mind

When a town's postal facility earns Voluntary Protection Programs (VPP) status — it's good. When two of a town's worksites achieve the safety milestone — it's even better.

The Main Post Office and the Eastside Station of Dalton, Georgia, have earned VPP status — the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA) highest safety recognition.

Both worksites received plaques and a VPP flag to display. Dalton employees said they're proud of their newly earned status, but realize that it's one step in an ongoing process.

"We have to stay committed to the standards we've worked hard to achieve," Postmaster Sherry Hill said.

For those who served

First issued in 2003, the Purple Heart stamp features the medal that the Military Order of the Purple Heart says is "the oldest military decoration in the world." The Purple Heart is awarded to members of the U.S. military wounded or killed in action.



On Aug. 7, 1782, General George Washington issued an order that established a badge of distinction for meritorious action. First known as the Badge of Military Merit, the award was distinctive because it was available to the lower ranks at a time when only officers were eligible for decoration in European armies. "The road to glory in a patriot army is thus open to all," Washington wrote.

The decoration was discontinued after the Revolutionary War. But the government announced its reinstatement on Feb. 22, 1932, the 200th anniversary of Washington's birth.

The stamp features a photograph by Ira Wexler of a Purple Heart awarded to James Loftus Fowler of Alexandria, Virginia. Fowler, a lieutenant colonel in the U.S. Marines, received his Purple Heart in 1968 following action in Vietnam.

Bright idea

Did you know compact fluorescent light bulbs produce the same amount of light as traditional incandescent bulbs but use about 75 percent less electricity?

And even though fluorescent light bulbs cost more than their incandescent cousins, users still save money because they last up to 10 times longer.

In fiscal year 2007, USPS spent more than \$526 million for electricity with much of the costs for lighting. Using compact fluorescent light bulbs will help lower utility bills. Changing just one 100-watt incandescent bulb to a 25-watt compact fluorescent light bulb saves more than \$90 in electricity costs each year.

Osteoporosis prevention and awareness

May is National Osteoporosis Awareness and Prevention Month — a good time to learn more about the disease that affects nearly half of all women and 20 percent of all men.

Osteoporosis, which means “porous bones,” causes bones to become thin, brittle and easily broken. Although there is no cure, osteoporosis is preventable in most cases by keeping bones strong. How? Eat a diet high in calcium and vitamin D, exercise, don't smoke and limit alcohol use.

Early intervention can prevent devastating fractures. It is recommended that men and women aged 50 or older ask their doctor for a bone density scan to detect loss of bone mass. The scan is easy, safe and painless.

Sticking around


The option for customers to place repositionable notes (RPNs) — those 3 x 3 inch removable paper notes placed on the outside of commercial First-Class Mail, Standard Mail and periodical mail — is now permanently available for use on cards, letters and flats.

The notes offer customers a great way to highlight important messages such as Web addresses, phone numbers and upcoming sales and events. These notes add valuable “real estate” to the outside of a mailpiece and are priced right. RPNs cost half a cent for First-Class Mail and one-and-a-half cents for Standard Mail and periodicals.

Since their introduction a few years ago, RPNs have raised \$4.3 million in revenue for USPS.

Overview

In June the Postal Service™ will dedicate a pane of 16 stamps to honor designers Charles and Ray Eames. Perhaps best known for their furniture, they were husband and wife as well as design partners. Their extraordinary body of creative work — reflecting the nation's youthful and inventive outlook after World War II — also included architecture, films and exhibits. The Eameses used new materials and technology to create high-quality products that addressed everyday problems and made modern design, including the molded plywood chair, available to the American public.

The Eames stamps will be dedicated June 17 at the Eames Office in Santa Monica, California. A special unveiling ceremony will take place the week prior at the NeoCon design conference in Chicago, Illinois, where 50,000 people are expected to attend. Information on the stamps will be included in the daily conference newsletter, and those attending will have the opportunity to pre-order stamps.

These colorful and provocative stamps provide the Postal Service with an opportunity to educate the public about elements of modern design as well as reach out to the design community by staging local dedication events and other activities that bring together postal representatives, designers, art design students and other stakeholders.

Suggested Publicity Ideas for Stamp Dedication Events and Related Activities

There are many opportunities available for promoting the *Charles and Ray Eames* stamps, particularly the design community, including art design students, educators and other postal stakeholders.

- Nationally, PAC has worked with the Eames Office and Herman Miller galleries to identify museums and galleries where Eames work can be found. If there are museums or Herman Miller galleries near you, please involve them in your planning process.
- To schedule an event in a museum, start first with the PR contact on the list included in this kit. Ask if tickets could be made available to attendees to tour the museum as part of the event.
- The Eames stamps provide an opportunity for outreach to local colleges and university art design departments. Contact the dean of the art department and ask to meet with him/her to discuss the *Charles and Ray Eames* stamps. Ask if the art department is interested in hosting an on-campus event that brings working designers and art design students together. Suggest a mix-and-mingle format and schedule the event at a time that will maximize news coverage potential. Don't forget the student newspaper to promote the event. This event might include an introduction of the stamp designs by the postmaster, along with a panel discussion of modern design with local artists and educators serving as panelists.

- Sponsor or host a design challenge for students at the local high school, community college or art school to draw/sketch/create and photograph an original piece. Turn the winning design into a piece of customized postage that the school or local Post Office™ could sell. The winning design also could be turned into a premium postcard or greeting card through the CardStore at www.usps.com.
- There has been tremendous interest in USPS Art Director and Designer Derry Noyes who designed the Eames stamps and knew the designers personally. She is available for media interviews upon request. If a media outlet is interested in interviewing Ms. Noyes, please contact Michael Woods (michael.p.woods@usps.gov, 202-268-7236).
- Form an event team consisting of the local postmaster, customer relations coordinator and district Marketing staff, and PAC representative.
- Order stamp enlargements or framed stamp art and lapel pins for the event, and determine if the local Post Office is interested in making the stamps available for sale at the event.

Charles and Ray Eames Stamps Backgrounder



In June, the Postal Service will dedicate a pane of 16 stamps to honor designers Charles and Ray Eames. Perhaps best known for their furniture, they were husband and wife as well as design partners. Their extraordinary body of creative work — reflecting the nation's youthful and inventive outlook after World War II — also included architecture, films and exhibits. The Eameses used new materials and technology to create high-quality products that addressed everyday problems and made modern design including molded plywood chairs available to the American public.

Charles Ormond Eames, Jr., was born in St. Louis, Missouri, June 17, 1907. He studied architecture briefly at Washington University in St. Louis. He worked as an architect before joining the Cranbrook Academy of Art in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan, in 1938, first as a student, and then as an instructor and administrator. Bernice Alexandra Kaiser was born on December 15, 1912, in Sacramento, California. She studied abstract painting in New York City, where she was nicknamed "Ray" before leaving Manhattan for the Cranbrook Academy in 1940. (She officially changed her name to Ray in 1954.)

When Charles and Ray met in 1940, they realized that they shared a strong belief in the philosophy that design could improve modern living. They quickly formed an artistic partnership that transcended both architecture and painting and was distinguished by a fascination with structure, science and technology, as well as a keen design sensibility and eye for detail. According to their grandson, Eames Demetrios, it was "a meeting of minds as well as of hearts". They married in June 1941 and moved to Los Angeles the following month, eager to continue their design experiments in a region known for its technological innovation. Two years later, they established what would become

"The Office of Charles and Ray Eames". Located in a large warehouse in Venice, California, the Eames Office (as it is more commonly known) was the center of Eames design ingenuity for more than 40 years.

One of their most popular designs was the molded plywood chair. Introduced in 1946, the chair was mass-produced using a method for bending or molding plywood that the Eameses had developed during the 1940s. The molded plywood chair was affordable, comfortable and could be used in virtually any setting, qualities inherent in most pieces of Eames furniture. In the years that followed, Charles and Ray created other attractive and durable pieces, and they pioneered the use of plastic, aluminum and wire mesh in modern furniture. By 1978, they had put more than 40 designs into production, including sofas, tables, storage units and airport seating.

The design duo demonstrated that innovations made by wartime industries could also be adapted for residential architecture. In 1949, the Eames Office completed its design of *Case Study House #8*. Located in Pacific Palisades, California, the house was erected quickly using prefabricated parts available at much lower cost than traditional wood. It was part of a program developed by *Arts & Architecture* magazine to create single-family homes from materials and technologies developed during World War II. The award-winning design was praised around the world for its beauty and harmony with the surrounding environment, and it confirmed that modern architecture could be both attractive and affordable. The house was designated a National Historic Landmark in September 2006.

Interested in images as an effective means of communication, Charles and Ray Eames began making slide shows and short films in the 1950s. In 1959, they produced *Glimpses of the USA*, a multi-screen presentation that featured a collage of images of the United States during a typical day. The film, which emphasized the beauty in the similarities and differences between peoples, was shown to great acclaim at a public exhibition in Moscow. Other films, such as *Tops* (1969) and *Powers of Ten* (1977), imaginatively merged art and science for a popular audience. The couple made more than 125 films between 1950 and 1978. They also designed more than 10 richly detailed museum exhibits about science, technology, history and other cultures.

According to Charles Eames, he and Ray believed that the role of the designer is essentially that of a good host, anticipating the needs of the guest. Today most of their furniture and many of their products are still being made and can be found in private homes and public spaces across the country. More importantly, Charles and Ray Eames lived as they worked, devoting their days and nights to sharing their sense of wonder and encouraging all of us to live creatively.

Charles Eames died in St. Louis, Missouri, on August 21, 1978. Ray died in Los Angeles, California, on the same day in 1988.

About the Stamps

The objects that appear on the stamps were selected from hundreds of items created by Charles and Ray Eames and represent the breadth of their extraordinary body of creative work.

Christmas Card

Charles and Ray Eames delighted friends and family during the holiday season with Christmas cards they designed themselves. The photograph they used in 1944 displays their affection and playful sense of humor. Ray mischievously holds an ornament above Charles' head. Behind them stands one of a number of molded plywood sculptures they created during the 1940s.

Crosspatch Fabric Design

Crosspatch is one of two fabric designs submitted by the couple to a 1947 competition sponsored by The Museum of Modern Art in New York City. The colorful rows of blocks filled with either a cross or a dot recall traditional quilt designs as well as Ray's love of abstract art. She created the pattern in 1945.

Stacking Chairs

Introduced in 1955, these stacking chairs feature single-shell seats made of plastic that comfortably support the body. Available in a variety of colors, the chairs are noted for their versatility. The simple design allows them to be stacked for storage or linked together in horizontal rows, a useful solution for temporary seating in public places.

Case Study House #8

The house was completed in 1949 as part of a program to create affordable homes out of materials and technology developed during World War II. Located in Pacific Palisades, California, the house is composed of two two-story structures made of steel and glass and connected by an open court. It was designated a National Historic Landmark in 2006.

Wire-Base Table

Charles and Ray Eames experimented with the use of wire rods in furniture for several years before introducing the wire-base table in 1950. The table features a plywood top supported by two, U-shaped wire rods and steadied with metal cross-bracing. Portable and practical, the petite table was ready for use anytime, indoors or outdoors.

Lounge Chair and Ottoman

A recognizable symbol of 20th-century design, the lounge chair and ottoman modernized the traditional English armchair. Each piece is made of a molded plywood shell set atop a swivel base. Padded cushions add the “warm, receptive look of a well-used first baseman’s mitt” that Charles Eames was trying to achieve. The 1956 design was an instant bestseller.

Hang-It-All

The Hang-It-All was designed in 1953 as an accessory for a playroom or child’s bedroom. The whimsical piece is made of several wire rods bent into hooks and capped with colorful wooden balls. Secured to the wall, the Hang-It-All could hold just about anything a child wanted it to.

La Chaise

Charles and Ray Eames submitted La Chaise to the 1948 International Competition for Low-Cost Furniture Design sponsored by The Museum of Modern Art in New York. The chair’s deep curves echo contemporary sculptures and can hold one or several people comfortably. Although only a fiberglass prototype was made at the time, La Chaise has become a design icon.

Tops

The designers used their own collection of tops to make this 1969 film. Without narration or text, *Tops* explores the physical and artistic beauty of a simple children’s toy. For 7 minutes and 15 seconds, more than 100 tops from around the world dance and whirl across the screen to a score composed by Elmer Bernstein.

Wire Mesh Chair

Light and easily portable, the wire mesh chair has a seat of woven wire shaped to fit the contours of the human body. Thick wire rods form a sturdy base. Introduced by the Eames Office in 1951, it was the first piece of American furniture to receive a mechanical patent.

Magazine Cover

Ray Eames created this cover for the May 1943 issue of *California Arts & Architecture*, an avant-garde design magazine based in Los Angeles. Fresh and contemporary, the design reflects Ray’s background in abstract art as well as the magazine’s commitment to modernism. She designed more than 25 covers for the magazine during the 1940s.

House of Cards

The House of Cards best demonstrates the designers’ ethos of taking pleasure seriously. Developed in 1952, the deck consists of 54 playing cards decorated with a starburst on one side and a photograph on the other. Interlocking slots on the sides of each card invite children and adults

to free their imaginations and build whatever their hearts desire.

Molded Plywood Sculpture

During the 1940s, Charles and Ray Eames experimented with a method for molding or bending pieces of wood in different directions. This abstract plywood sculpture was one of many they created as they experimented with the process. Once they had perfected the method, they used it to produce durable furniture made of molded wood.

Eames Storage Unit

Charles and Ray Eames introduced the Eames Storage Unit (ESU) in 1950 as a sleek and practical solution to home and office organization. Not only was the ESU affordable, it was also customizable. The components of this modular cabinet, made of chrome-plated steel and plywood, were available in a variety of standard heights, widths and colors.

Aluminum Group Chair

The Aluminum Group Chair offered an affordable option for those seeking high-quality indoor-outdoor seating for the home or office. The fabric of the chair’s sling seat is stretched around the frame, making it sturdy and comfortable. Introduced by the Eames Office in 1958, the Aluminum Group collection also includes tables and an ottoman.

Molded Plywood Chair

The molded plywood chair was affordable, comfortable and could be used in virtually any setting, qualities inherent in most pieces of Eames furniture. It was also one of the Eameses’ most popular designs. Introduced in 1946, the chair was mass-produced using a method for bending or molding plywood that they had developed during the 1940s.



DMM Revision: Repositionable Notes Transitioned From an Experimental Test to a Permanent Classification

Effective May 12, 2008, the Postal Service™ revised *The Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) to reflect Repositionable Notes (RPNs) as a permanent classification by deleting DMM section 709.3 and moving it to 705.21.

In accordance with the Postal Accountability and Enhancement Act, the Postal Service gave notice to the Postal Regulatory Commission that the Board of Governors established RPNs as a permanent classification. The three inch by three inch removable, paper notes are an optional feature for discount First-Class Mail®, Periodicals, and Standard Mail®.

Over a three-year testing period, RPNs have proven compatible with postal automation letter and flat processing equipment. The removable notes can be mailed on postcards, envelopes, flats, catalogs, magazines, and

newspapers to highlight important information or special offers. The notes are easily removed so that customers can keep the information handy.

RPNs add to the value of mail as an advertising medium and contribute directly to net postal revenue. The use of RPNs has aided customers with increasing brand awareness and generated sales and repeat business for their organizations.

We will incorporate these revisions into the next printed version of the DMM and into the monthly update of the online DMM, which is available via Postal Explorer® at <http://pe.usps.com>.

- In an effort to reduce waste and still provide each postal facility with the proper quantity of *Mover's Guide*, call 800-816-6837 if you receive too many or too few copies of *Mover's Guide* or if you have questions about your quantity.

- To find out when shipments will arrive, contact the Material Distribution Center (MDC) directly at 800-273-1509.
- If your facility receives an entire pallet of *Mover's Guide* copies, please break down the pallet! It may contain boxes that need to be shipped to other facilities, and this will ensure all facilities receive their needed supply.

- You must recycle any old versions of the *Mover's Guide* remaining at your facility.

On June 2, 2008, all Post Offices™ will begin to receive an automatic shipment of 50 of the new Label 11-HFPU, *Express Mail Hold For Pick Up*, that will be replacing the Express Mail Label 11A, *Next Day Post Office to Post Office Label*. Post Offices should continue to use the existing Label 11A until June 16, 2008, when it will become obsolete. After June 16, 2008, and when Post Offices have received their shipment of the new Label 11-HFPU, they should destroy all existing stock of the Label 11A using municipal recycling programs wherever possible.

How to Order the New Label 11-HFPU after June 9, 2008

Post Offices that have access to eBuy should order their supplies at <https://ebuy.usps.gov>.

Post Offices that do not have access to eBuy should contact the Material Distribution Center (MDC) for ordering their supplies at 1-800-273-1509. Post Offices may order

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

U.S. Flag at Half-Staff

How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.

Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.



Note 1: When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, display the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, *not* at half-staff.

Note 2: On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.

POW-MIA Flag

How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.



Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.



Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service® only as described above. If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 800-843-5678.

Household Diary Study

The Postal Service's Household Diary Study (HDS), conducted since 1987, provides information about the contents of the mail sent and received by U.S. households. The Postal Service™ uses this information to help understand why and how customers use the mail. The results are used to:

- Forecast mail volume.
- Plan marketing strategies.
- Provide information for rate-setting purposes.

The HDS is administered at Headquarters by the Office of Demand Forecasting and Analysis, Finance. NuStats, the HDS survey research firm contractor since July 1999, conducts the interviews and collects and analyzes the HDS data throughout the year.

HDS is a two-stage survey. Stage 1 is the Household Interview. NuStats sends an advance letter, signed by the postmaster general, to a representative sample of U.S. households. This letter emphasizes the importance of the HDS and asks for participation. These sample households are contacted either by telephone or in person and asked about the mail they send and receive, their adoption and use of various communications' technologies, their attitudes about mail service in general, and information relating to their household and personal demographics. Those respondent households are recruited to participate in HDS Stage 2.

Stage 2 is the Mail Diary. NuStats asks households that agree to participate in Stage 2 to record information about the mail they send and receive for a 7-day period from Monday to Sunday. Information recorded includes number of mailpieces received and sent, industry mail source, mail

characteristics, and attitudes regarding mail received. As an incentive for HDS Stage 2 participation, households are offered the options of receiving \$30 or a roll of 100 First-Class Mail® stamps.

Customers who participate in Stage 2 of the HDS can expect to receive their incentive about 2 months after they return the diary packet to NuStats.

Data gathered in both HDS stages is available in a final report, *The Household Diary Study — Mail Use and Attitudes*. The report is published in hard copy and a free electronic file. Tax Obligations of USPS Employees

As employees of the United States Postal Service®, we have a legal, moral and fiduciary obligation to obey the tax laws of our country. As both citizens and public servants who are obligated to uphold the public trust, we are ethically mandated to complete and file all required tax forms for our federal, state and, where applicable, local taxes. We are required by appropriate taxation laws to pay all of our required taxes in a timely and accurate manner.

Regrettably, the USPS® has recently received a number of notifications from federal, state and local taxing authorities indicating that an increasing percentage of our employees have some type of income tax delinquency. For example, the Internal Revenue Service (and several other federal agencies) have issued Federal Tax Levies and Salary Offsets against approximately 8,000 of our employees. To have this many employees with a balance owed is more than just an issue between the IRS and an individual. When USPS employees are viewed as being non-compliant with the proper payments of their federal taxes, it impacts the public's confidence in our abilities to conduct our assigned mission of delivering the mail.

The IRS wants to assist all USPS employees in meeting their tax filing and payment requirements. Adherence to these requirements will help all USPS employees to avoid costly penalties and the potential of tax enforcement action by the IRS. Please note that the IRS provides free tax information and services to inform and assist taxpayers concerning tax laws and individual responsibilities. Call toll free at 800-829-1040 to contact an IRS representative for further federal tax information.

Additionally, state and local taxing authorities as well as state courts have reported an increase in the number of USPS employees with outstanding state tax levies, unpaid student loans or commercial garnishments. During calendar year 2007, we processed more than 33,000 of these orders from these state and local entities. As with federal taxes, USPS employees are reminded that they are responsible for prompt payment of all of their debts.

Also, many state and local taxing authorities are reporting large numbers of incomplete or missing forms regarding the withholding of their appropriate state/local taxes. If you work in one of the 41 states that currently have an income tax, please make certain that the correct state taxes are being withheld. If they are not (e.g., if you recently moved to an assignment in a different state from your last

assignment), you should immediately complete the state tax form that is appropriate for your new work location. If you work in a locality that is subject to taxes through payroll deduction, and the correct deductions are not being assessed from your pay, you should immediately complete a Form PS 4, *Employee's City or County Withholding Certificate*. Employees are reminded that appropriate state/local employment taxes are withheld from salaries based upon your work location, not your place of residence. For example, if you work in a state and/or locality that assesses a tax, the appropriate tax is withheld because that is where you work. Although you may live in a non-taxing state/locality, your place of residence has no bearing upon the payment of taxes at your work location. **Note:** Some states do have bilateral agreements concerning the collection of state taxes. However, there are no such official agreements concerning local taxes.

All employees are bound by the materials contained within the *Code of Ethics, Principles of Ethical Conduct for Government Officers and Employees*. This includes Principle 12 which states, "An employee shall satisfy in good faith their obligations as citizens, including all just financial obligations, especially those — such as federal, state or local taxes — that are imposed by law." It is essential that all Postal Service™ employees adhere to the highest possible ethical standards concerning the payment of their taxes and other debts.

Safety: Preventing and Treating Heat Illness

Working hard on a summer day, you suddenly become aware of feeling ill.

- What’s happening?
- How do you address it?
- How can you prevent it in the future?

Heat illness is a hazard caused by temperature, humidity, radiant heat (such as from the sun), and air speed. How you react to these factors depends upon your age, weight, fitness level, medical condition, and acclimatization to the heat.

Your body attempts to regulate heat through blood flow and sweating. When your muscles are working, blood flow

is hindered. Less blood is available to flow to the skin and release the heat. Sweating is effective **only if**:

- The humidity level is low enough to permit evaporation.
- The fluids and salts lost are adequately replaced.

With insufficient regulation, heat is stored, your body’s core temperature rises, and your heart rate increases. If you don’t take measures to cool your body, nausea, irritability, and lack of focus may follow.

Let’s take a look at the syndromes and causes of heat stress and how they can be recognized, prevented, and treated.

Syndrome	Causes, Symptoms, and Effects	Prevention and Treatment
Fainting (<i>heat syncope</i>)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Occurs when an individual who is unaccustomed to hot weather remains standing still in the heat. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Be aware of heat syncope at the beginning of summer. ■ Prevent by moving around, rather than standing still, to reduce the possibility of fainting. ■ Treat by having the victim lie down; victims usually recover quickly after a brief period of lying down.
Heat rash (<i>prickly heat</i>)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ May occur in hot and humid environments where sweat remains on the surface of the skin. ■ When extensive or complicated by infection, heat rash can be so uncomfortable that the victim’s sleep and job performance are negatively affected. ■ May cause disability. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Prevent heat rash by resting in a cool place and allowing the skin to dry.
Heat cramps	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Dehydration causes painful muscle spasms ■ May be the first stage of heat illness. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Prevent and treat by drinking plain water (the body conserves electrolytes, so perspiration is mainly water that the body needs to replace). ■ Avoid fluids with added sugar; the sugar delays absorption by the stomach. ■ Don’t use sports drinks for your main fluid replacement because a high concentration of electrolytes increases the risk of dehydration and your need for more water.
Heat exhaustion	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Results from a failure to drink enough fluids or take in enough salt. ■ Occurs when an individual stops sweating because circulation is diverted to the body’s core in an effort to maintain core temperature. ■ The victim has cool, dry skin, a pale complexion, and a body temperature slightly higher than normal. ■ The victim may shiver and feel cold due to body fluids shifting to the core. ■ The victim may experience extreme weakness or fatigue, giddiness, nausea, or headache. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Rest in a cool place and drink water. ■ Seek medical attention for a victim who vomits or loses consciousness.

Syndrome	Causes, Symptoms, and Effects	Prevention and Treatment
Heat stroke	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Is a medical emergency requiring hospitalization. ■ The body no longer regulates its core temperature through adequate blood flow and sweating. ■ May begin very soon after heat exhaustion. ■ Signs include confusion, loss of consciousness, convulsions or coma, and hot, dry skin, which may be red, mottled, or bluish. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Call 911 immediately. ■ Treat promptly or death can occur. (Prompt first aid can prevent permanent injury to the brain and other vital organs.) ■ What to do while awaiting medical help: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Move the victim to a cool area. ■ Soak the victim's clothing with cool water. ■ Fan the victim vigorously to increase cooling. ■ Spray the victim with a cool mist of water, wipe the victim with a wet cloth, or cover with a wet sheet. ■ Place ice packs under the armpits and groin area.

To avoid heat illness, know what to look for. Be aware of the causes and symptoms of heat illness — for yourself and for your fellow workers!

- ◆ Give the person cool water to drink – about a cup every 15 minutes – unless he or she is nauseous or vomiting.
- ◆ Fan the victim and spray with a cool mist of water or apply a wet cloth to skin.
- ◆ Call 911 for emergency help if the person does not feel better in a few minutes.

HEAT STROKE — A MEDICAL EMERGENCY

Symptoms

- ◆ Dry, pale skin with no sweating
- ◆ Hot, red skin that looks sunburned
- ◆ Mood changes, irritability, confusion or the inability to think clearly
- ◆ Seizures
- ◆ Inability to revive from an unconscious state

CALL 911 for emergency help IMMEDIATELY.

Take action!

- ◆ Move the victim to a cool, shaded area. Don't leave the person alone. Lay the victim on his or her back. Move any nearby objects away if the victim is having seizures. If symptoms include nausea or vomiting, lay the victim on his or her side.
- ◆ Loosen and remove any heavy clothing.
- ◆ Give the person cool water to drink – about a cup every 15 minutes – unless the victim is nauseous or vomiting.
- ◆ Fan the victim and spray with a cool mist of water or wipe the victim with a wet cloth, or cover with a wet sheet.
- ◆ Place ice packs under the armpits and groin area.





Postmasters should requisition sufficient quantities of Items 333900 to meet the expected demand for this item by stamp collectors, conservationists, and hunters.

Postmasters must immediately send a separate PS Form 17 to their SDOs for enough *Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamps* to last until April 30, 2009. Post

Offices served by stamp service centers (SSCs) must follow their established ordering guidelines.

If the initial stamp supply is exhausted before April 30, 2009, postmasters must requisition additional quantities. Retail units with authorized philatelic centers should order Item 333900 and have them available to meet philatelic demand. All postmasters/station managers must ensure that *Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation Stamps* are available to meet public demand.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of those postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POSTMARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® Web site at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow

sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark and do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of non-specified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to: Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.
