IMM Revision: Elimination of the Requirement for a Written Permit to Export Tobacco Seeds and Tobacco Plants

Effective December 4, 2008, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, International Mail Manual (IMM®)* section 138.22 and subchapter 560 to eliminate the regulation that requires a written permit issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture to export tobacco seeds and live tobacco plants.

The legislative authority concerning exports of tobacco seeds and live tobacco plants outlined in subchapter 560 of the IMM was repealed by Public Law (P.L.) 102-237, and

the requirement under the Tobacco Seeds and Plant Exportation Act, P.L. 76-543, no longer exists.

We will incorporate this revision into the next printed version of the IMM and into the monthly update of the online IMM, which is available via Postal Explorer® at <http://pe.usps.com>.

Publication 52 Revision: Elimination of the Requirement for a Written Permit to Export Tobacco Seeds and Tobacco Plants

Effective December 4, 2008, the Postal Service™ is revising Publication 52, *Hazardous, Restricted, and Perishable Mail*, section 643.3, to eliminate the regulation that requires a written permit issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture to export tobacco seeds and live tobacco plants.

The legislative authority concerning exports of tobacco seeds and live tobacco plants outlined in section 643.3 of Publication 52 was repealed by Public Law (P.L.) 102-237, and the requirement under the Tobacco Seeds and Plant Exportation Act, P.L. 76-543, no longer exists.

This revision eliminates the requirement for a written permit to export tobacco seeds and live tobacco plants. Accordingly, sections 643.3, 643.4, 643.5, and 643.6 will be deleted in their entirety.

We will incorporate this revision into the next printed version of Publication 52 and into the updated online version of Publication 52, which is available via Postal Explorer® at <http://pe.usps.com>.

Forms

Revised PS Form 8170 and Freedom of Information Act Reporting Requirements

Effectively immediately, PS Form 8170, *Freedom of Information Act Request Report*, is revised (see pages 6–8). The title of the form has been changed to *Freedom of Information Act Request Report*. The form collects information needed to meet new reporting requirements imposed by changes in the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 U.S.C. 552. Specifically, the Open Government Act of 2007, Public Law No. 110-175, 121 Stat. 252, which amended subsection (e) of the FOIA, now requires that agencies provide additional details regarding response times for both initial requests and administrative appeals, including data on the ten oldest pending requests and appeals. In addition, agencies are now required to report information regarding expedited review and fee waiver requests.

Who Must Complete the Form?

Postmasters, district managers, vice presidents, and other records custodians (see Handbook AS-353, *Guide to Privacy, the Freedom of Information Act, and Records Management*, 4-8) must complete PS Form 8170 for each request processed under FOIA. The collection and reporting of this information are required by the FOIA statute.

When Must Forms be Submitted?

Any outstanding reports for requests processed during fiscal year 2008 should be completed and submitted by November 29, 2008.

Exceptions

Do not complete PS Form 8170 for any of the following:

- Requests for individual change-of-address information under Handbook AS-353, 5-2d.
- Requests from federal, state, or local government agencies for any type of information.

- Requests from a union, unless the request cites FOIA and/or the Privacy Act.

Where to send reports

Field offices submit reports to the area consumer service program analyst (CSPA) or district Consumer Affairs manager (CAM), who serves as FOIA coordinator.

Custodians located at Headquarters and in Headquarters field units submit reports to the manager, Records Office, at Headquarters (reports may be sent via facsimile to 202-268-5353 or via e-mail to *FOIA – PA*).

FOIA coordinators submit reports to the manager, Records Office, at Headquarters (reports may be sent via facsimile to 202-268-5353 or via e-mail to *FOIA – PA*). Coordinators are responsible for verifying the forms for accuracy of completion before submitting them to the Records Office.

FOIA EXEMPTION GUIDELINES FOR FEDERAL AGENCIES TO WITHHOLD INFORMATION

- (b)(1) - National Defense and Foreign Relations - applies to classified national defense and foreign relations information.
- (b)(2) - Personnel Rules and Practices - applies to records related solely to internal personnel rules and practices that are either (a) too trivial to be of genuine public interest, or (b) would enable circumvention of laws or regulations.
- (b)(3) - Federal Law - applies to information that is exempt from disclosure under another federal statute, such as:
 - 39 U.S.C. 410(c)(1): The name or address, past or present, of any Postal Service customer.
 - 39 U.S.C. 410(c)(2): Information of a commercial nature, including trade secrets, whether or not obtained from a person outside the Postal Service, which under good business practice would not be publicly disclosed.
 - 39 U.S.C. 410(c)(3): Information prepared for use in the negotiation of collective bargaining agreements.
 - 39 U.S.C. 410(c)(4): Information prepared for use in connection with proceedings under chapter 36 of this title.
 - 39 U.S.C. 410(c)(5): The reports and memoranda of consultants or independent contractors except to the extent that they would be required to be disclosed if prepared within the Postal Service.
 - 39 U.S.C. 410(c)(6): Investigatory files, whether or not considered closed, compiled for law enforcement purposes except to the extent available by law to a party other than the Postal Service.
 - 39 U.S.C. 412: Prohibits the disclosure of mailing lists or other lists of names or addresses (past or present) of Postal Service customers or other persons to the public by any means or for any purpose.
 - 39 U.S.C. 3016(d) – Documentary material provided pursuant to any subpoena in 3005 administrative actions.
 - 18 U.S.C. 1461: Records concerning non-mailable matter.
 - 18 U.S.C. 2510 and 18 U.S.C. 2517: Records related to wiretap requests.
 - Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure – Rule 6(e): Grand Jury Information.
- (b)(4) - Trade Secrets and Privileged Information - applies to trade secrets and privileged or confidential commercial or financial information provided to the Postal Service by a party outside the Postal Service.
- (b)(5) - Internal or Interagency Information - applies to interagency or internal memoranda or letters that would not be available by law to a private party in litigation with the Postal Service.
- (b)(6) - Personal Information - applies to personal information, including medical and personnel files, the disclosure of which would be a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
- (b)(7) - Law Enforcement Records - applies to records compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that providing these records:
 - (A) Could reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings.
 - (B) Would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or impartial adjudication.
 - (C) Could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
 - (D) Could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of a confidential source.
 - (E) Would disclose techniques, procedures, and guidelines used in law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, if the disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law.
 - (F) Could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING PS FORM 8170

These instructions must be followed carefully. Any written request for Postal Service records that are processed in accordance with the "Freedom of Information Act" or "FOIA". Reference 39 CFR 265 and USPS Handbook AS-353, Chapter 4.

The following exceptions apply: (a) Requests for individual change of address information from process servers or government agencies (refer to section 5-2d of Handbook AS-353), (b) Requests from federal, state, or local government agencies for any type of information, (c) Requests from a union, unless the request specifically cites the FOIA or includes the written consent of the records subject authorizing the Postal Service to release records to the union representative, and (d) Any preprinted form, either a Postal Service form or third party form (e.g., from mortgage companies), on which the only reference to the Privacy Act is a Privacy Act notice.

1. Enter Requester's Name: *(Enter the individual's full name appearing in the signature line. Enter the name as the requester states it. For example: E. James Smith, "E" is the first name, "J" the middle initial and "Smith" is the last name.)*
2. Enter the Requester's Organization: *(Enter the name of the requester's organization.)*
3. Enter the Requester's Title: *(Enter the title of the requester, e.g. Esq, Vice President, Legal Assistant.)*
4. Indicate Category Type: *(Check one box that best describes the type of requester. Check the "Other" box for all requests from individuals, except for requests received by individuals representing the interests of a business entity, educational institution, a scientific organization, or from the news media.)*
5. Provide Requester's Address, Email Address and Telephone Number: *(Enter complete address, email address and include telephone area code.)*
6. Enter Date of Request: *(Enter the date (MM/DD/YYYY) on the requester's letter. If letter is undated, use postmark.)*
7. Enter Date Received: *(Enter the date (MM/DD/YYYY) the request was received at the facility processing the request. This date is important because it begins the statutory (20) business day start time to respond to the request.)*
8. Indicate if Expedited Processing was requested. (Check "Yes" if the requester asked for expedited processing. Check "No" if the requester did not request expedited processing. Check "Yes" if the requester asked for expedited processing and it was granted. Check "No" if expedited processing was denied.) Enter the date the requester was notified of the decision to grant expedited processing or not.
9. Type of Request: Indicate if the request was a simple or complex request (examples of a complex request are: voluminous amount of records or the coordination of the request amongst multiple offices.)
10. Name of Person on Whose Behalf Request is made: *(Provide the name of the person or the organization represented by the requester.)*
11. Description of Records Requested: *(Provide a complete description of the records requested, describing the primary request first and then any subsequent secondary requests. Use general terms in making the request — Contract Number, Personnel, Investigatory, Medical, or a short description like "Complaints made at the Main Post Office in 2004". Do not describe records that are of a sensitive nature, such as EAP, psychiatric, disciplinary, etc.)*
12. Indicate if a Fee Waiver was requested. (Check "Yes" if the requester asked for a fee waiver. Check "No" if the requester did not request a fee waiver. Check "Yes" if the requester asked for a fee waiver and it was granted. Check "No" if a fee waiver was denied.) Enter the date the requester was notified of the decision to waive fees or not.
13. Accountability of PS Form 8170: *(Provide the name of the person that completed the PS Form 8170, including the date the form was completed, telephone number, name of the office/facility, and name of the department.)*
14. Indicate the Final Disposition Action Taken: *(Check one box that reflects the predominant action taken. If the records were denied in full or denied in part, the exemption and statute relied upon to withhold those records must be indicated.)*
15. Enter the total number of hours used to process the request in half hour increments: *(The total number of hours should be calculated to include interpreting the content of the request, to search for the records, to review the records, to prepare the written response and if necessary to reproduce the records.)*
16. Enter the date the response was completed: *(Provide the date (MM/DD/YYYY) the requester was provided a final response letter. The date on the letter and the date the response was mailed/mailed should reflect the same date.)*

Household Diary Study

The Postal Service's Household Diary Study (HDS), conducted since 1987, provides information about the contents of the mail sent and received by U.S. households. The Postal Service™ uses this information to help understand why and how customers use the mail. The results are used to:

- Forecast mail volume.
- Plan marketing strategies.
- Provide information for rate-setting purposes.

The HDS is administered at Headquarters by the Office of Demand Forecasting and Analysis, Finance. NuStats, the HDS survey research firm contractor since July 1999, conducts the interviews and collects and analyzes the HDS data throughout the year.

HDS is a two-stage survey. Stage 1 is the Household Interview. NuStats sends an advance letter, signed by the postmaster general, to a representative sample of U.S. households. This letter emphasizes the importance of the HDS and asks for participation. These sample households are contacted either by telephone or in person and asked about the mail they send and receive, their adoption and use of various communications' technologies, their attitudes about mail service in general, and information relating to their household and personal demographics. Those respondent households are recruited to participate in HDS Stage 2.

Stage 2 is the Mail Diary. NuStats asks households that agree to participate in Stage 2 to record information about the mail they send and receive for a 7-day period from Monday to Sunday. Information recorded includes number of mailpieces received and sent, industry mail source, mail characteristics, and attitudes regarding mail received. As

an incentive for HDS Stage 2 participation, households are offered the options of receiving \$30 or a roll of 100 First-Class Mail® stamps.

Customers who participate in Stage 2 of the HDS can expect to receive their incentive about 2 months after they return the diary packet to NuStats.

Data gathered in both HDS stages is available in a final report, *The Household Diary Study — Mail Use and Attitudes*. The report is published in hard copy and a free electronic file. Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

U.S. Flag at Half-Staff


How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.

Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.



Note 1: When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, display the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, *not* at half-staff.

Note 2: On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.

POW-MIA Flag

How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.



Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.

Update on Purchasing and Reporting Gift Certificate, American Express Gift Cheque, and Merchandise Item Awards

The Postal Service™ has signed contracts with suppliers of gift certificates and gift checks to be used for recognition award items. Below is updated information for managers to use in implementing the program. Additional information can be found in the *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) 470, Pay Administration Recognition and Awards; Management Instruction FM-640-2000-1, *Employer Tax Reporting Responsibilities — Conference, Meeting, and Training Session Mementos or Gifts*; and the Compensation website, <http://blue.usps.gov/hrisp/comp/paysalary/awardsandrecognition.htm>.

Gift Certificates

Purchasing Requirements

There are two approved vendors that managers are authorized to use for purchasing gift certificate awards equaling \$25 or more in value: 1) GiftCertificates.com; and 2) IncentOne. (As of November 29, 2008, Rymax and Global Sports Access will no longer be part of the authorized gift certificate vendor program.) Gift certificates are considered off-catalog *eBuy* purchases. This means that you must obtain purchase approval through *eBuy*, but purchase gift certificates through the vendors' dedicated Postal Service websites (listed below) using a VISA SmartPay credit card for payment. You can find the vendors' addresses, contract numbers, and other information on their websites. \$10,000 is generally the purchasing competition threshold. Because these approved vendors have contracts with the Postal Service, the \$10,000 limit on purchases does not apply, and you are not required to send requisitions to Supply Management for orders exceeding this amount. The only limit on purchases is the limit on your VISA SmartPay Card.

Gift certificates purchased from the authorized vendors are generally limited to denominations of \$25, \$50, \$100, and \$250. However, certificates of different denominations may be purchased with the agreement of the vendor. In addition, managers may purchase gift certificates valued at less than \$25 from other sources, adhering to all Postal Service and local purchasing rules and regulations.

IncentOne offers a 5 percent face-value discount on the Gift Certificate Award. It provides access to over 400 retailer gift cards and thousands of electronic, entertainment, dining, and merchandise reward options.

Reporting Requirements

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires that *all* gift certificate awards, regardless of their value, be reported as income. The Postal Service *eAwards* application is the only authorized method for this reporting. Report gift certificate awards in *eAwards* under the appropriate award type, depending on the employee category and reason for the award. (**Note:** Not all employees are eligible to receive gift certificate awards, so verify a recipient's eligibility prior to presenting the award. The *eAwards* application will not accept reporting for employees ineligible to receive an award.)

For accounting purposes, gift certificate awards should be reported in the same pay period they are issued, but must be reported in the same calendar year they are issued for proper income reporting for tax purposes. The *eAwards* system normally stops accepting new award entries for fiscal year-end processing in late September, and for calendar year-end processing in late December. Awards not approved by the approver designated in *eAwards* before these cut-off dates are held for processing in either the next fiscal year or calendar year. The fiscal year cut-off date is announced in the annual *Postal Bulletin* article regarding fiscal year-end activity. The calendar year cut-off will be posted on the *eAwards* message board.

For career employees, the payroll system automatically calculates and pays tax assistance on gift certificate award amounts that equal or exceed \$50. The additional tax liability is charged to the finance number indicated in *eAwards* at the time of award submission and approval. Normal payroll deductions will be withheld from the paycheck relevant to the pay period the award is entered in *eAwards* for gift certificate awards valued at less than \$50 presented to career employees. Tax assistance is not provided for non-career employees who receive gift certificate awards.

These instructions apply to all gift card purchases. Additional processes and controls, set by the officer of an organization, may also apply.

American Express Gift Cheques

Purchasing Requirements

The Postal Service has entered into an exclusive contract with American Express for the purchase of Gift Cheques to be used as cash equivalent awards for employee recognition. American Express is the only authorized source of cash equivalent awards. No gift checks, debit cards, or other cash equivalent awards may be purchased from any other vendor. American Express Gift Cheques can be purchased only through *eBuy*; they may not be purchased directly from the American Express website or any other source.

American Express Gift Cheques are available only in \$100 denominations. You can issue American Express Gift Cheques purchased under this contract only as cash equivalent recognition awards; you cannot use them for any other purpose.

Reporting Requirements

The IRS requires that *all* cash equivalent awards, regardless of their value, be reported as income. The Postal Service *eAwards* application is the only authorized method for reporting this income. Report cash equivalent awards in *eAwards* under the appropriate award type, depending on the employee category and reason for the award. (**Note:** Not all employees are eligible to receive cash equivalent awards, so verify a recipient's eligibility prior to presenting the award. The *eAwards* application will not accept reporting for employees ineligible to receive an award.)

Cash equivalent awards should be reported in the same pay period they are issued for accounting purposes, but *must* be reported in the same calendar year as issuance for proper reporting for tax purposes. The *eAwards* system normally stops accepting new award entries for fiscal year-end processing in late September, and calendar year-end processing in late December. Awards not approved by the approver designated in *eAwards* before these cut-off dates are held for processing in either the next fiscal or calendar year. The payroll system automatically calculates and pays tax assistance on cash equivalent awards. The additional tax liability is charged to the finance number indicated in *eAwards* at the time of award submission and approval.

These instructions apply to all cash equivalent purchases. Additional processes and controls, set by the officer of an organization, may also apply.

Merchandise Items

Noncash tangible merchandise items may be used for recognition awards. These items include apparel, tickets for a specific sporting or entertainment event, plaques, electronic devices, and other personal property.

Purchasing Requirements

You can procure noncash tangible merchandise items locally in accordance with established Postal Service and local purchasing rules and regulations.

Reporting Requirements

Noncash tangible merchandise items are considered income by the IRS. If the value of merchandise items presented for recognition *is equal to or exceeds \$50*, report the award in *eAwards* under the appropriate award type depending on the reason for the award and the employee category. Personalizing a merchandise item, such as apparel or a plaque, does not exclude it from IRS reporting requirements, personalized items must be reported in *eAwards* if the value meets or exceeds the \$50 threshold. (**Note:** Not all employees are eligible to receive noncash tangible merchandise items as awards, so verify a recipient's eligibility prior to presenting the award. The *eAwards* application will not accept reporting for employees ineligible to receive an award.)

Awards and Gifts Presented at Conferences, Meetings, and Training Sessions

Specific Postal Service rules and IRS regulations exist for awards and gifts presented at on- and offsite meetings, training sessions, conferences, etc. See Management Instruction FM 640-2000-1, *Employer Tax Reporting Responsibilities — Conference, Meeting, and Training Session Mementos or Gifts*, for more information regarding gifts given to Postal Service employees by the Postal Service, and also by outside sources in this context.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of those postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POSTMARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® Web site at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of non-specified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.
