World Philatelic Exhibition in Washington, DC

With stamp exhibits from 135 countries, extraordinary first-day-of-issue stamp events and much more, the Washington 2006 World Philatelic Exhibition was a flurry of activity for thousands of stamp enthusiasts. USPS hit the ground running, with four first-day-of-issue ceremonies slated for the event.

Kicking things off Saturday, May 27, was the biggest, brightest, boldest stamp series ever issued. *Wonders of America: Land of Superlatives* highlights 40 natural wonders — from the largest estuary, to the windiest place, to the hottest spot in the country. This collection of 40 stamps showcases America's natural wonders at their finest. Postmaster General Jack Potter was on hand to dedicate the new stamps.

The *1606 Voyage of Samuel de Champlain* souvenir sheet commemorating the 400th anniversary of de Champlain's explorations also made its debut. Jointly issued by Canada Post and USPS, the sheet features two 50-cent Canadian stamps and two 39-cent U.S. stamps.

An homage to the collectors gathered for this event, the *Washington 2006 World Philatelic Exposition* souvenir sheet features reproductions of three stamps issued in 1923. These stamps depict well-known Washington, DC, sights — the Lincoln Memorial, the U.S. Capitol and the statue "Freedom" — and appear on the sheet in their original denominations. Perhaps even more special for

collectors — the stamps were printed using the original 1923 stamp dyes.

Purple Heart stamp reissued



Unveiling the Purple Heart stamp in Washington, DC, were National Commander Military Order of the Purple Heart James Randles, USPS Board of Governors Chairman James C. Miller, Secretary of Veterans Affairs R. James Nicholson, Postmaster General Jack Potter and Senior VP Government Relations Thomas Day.

It was the first U.S. military decoration ever issued — a simple purple heart-shaped piece of cloth. Instituted by General George Washington in 1782, the award was given to three men for bravery during the American Revolution.

In 2003, the Postal Service issued the *Purple Heart* stamp, paying tribute to the hundreds of men and women who have received the medal,

now given for wounds received during combat. In the three years since it was issued, it has proven to be one of the most popular stamps with many civic organizations.

Board of Governors Chairman James C. Miller rededicated the stamp in Washington, DC, at the new 39-cent price. Postmaster General Jack Potter attended the ceremony as well. “Since the stamp was issued three years ago, it has reminded almost every American of what others have suffered to protect the ideals that remain at the heart of the American experience,” Potter said. “In rededicating this stamp today, we have 50 million new opportunities to tell their story.”

FSA updates phone prompt, account balances

If you’re a Flexible Spending Account (FSA) participant, you know you can call the FSA Customer Service Center at 800-842-2026 and press “1” for the automated system to check on a filed claim or the balance left in your health care or dependent care FSA.

What you may not know is that the phone prompt has been updated to explain a change that began in January. To access your account information, you must enter zero followed by your 8-digit employee ID. Then, enter your FSA personal identification number (PIN).

Your FSA PIN was automatically assigned by the FSA Customer Service Center when you enrolled and was printed on your FSA enrollment confirmation notice. It’s different from your USPS PIN. Of course, you always can call

the FSA Customer Service Center and press “2” to speak to a representative.

When filing a claim, just write down your 8-digit employee ID — don’t add a zero, and don’t use your Social Security number.

Potter dedicates AMBER Alert stamp

Postmaster General Jack Potter was on hand at the first-day-of-issue ceremony for the *AMBER Alert* stamp, issued simultaneously in Washington, DC, and in Arlington, TX — hometown of Amber Hagerman. The girl was abducted in 1996 while riding her bicycle. A national alert system

named in her memory now notifies the public when a confirmed child abduction has taken place.

“I’m not asking you to save the *AMBER Alert* stamp, I’m asking you to use it,” said Potter. “Put this stamp on every card, every letter, every package you mail and help share its message of hope with every American family. Help us bring attention to this very important issue. With 80 million *AMBER Alert* stamps, we can raise awareness like never before.”

Retail Standardization from the customer’s perspective

When Palm Springs, CA, customer services supervisor Thetus Nelson and retail associates Sonia Valadez and Mike Micotto formed a Retail Standardization team, they took a walk in their customers’ shoes — and it added up to increased revenue.

They walked around the office, looking from the customer’s perspective, and made changes, like moving Official Licensed Retail Product (OLRP) items and ReadyPost shipping supplies to locations where customers could see them — and buy them.

Total retail revenue is up 11.7 percent year-to-date compared with the same period last year. Express Mail revenue is up 24.1 percent, Priority Mail 15.7 percent and First-Class Mail 8.8 percent. OLRP and ReadyPost

revenue had a combined increase in April of more than \$5,100 — an impressive 44.4 percent jump.

Hurricane Preparedness Week

Speaking at a conference in Miami to kick off Hurricane Preparedness Week, which ran through May 27, National Hurricane Center Director Max Mayfield said the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration has predicted this year's hurricane season will be above-normal and very active. Studies indicate an 80 percent chance of an above-

normal hurricane season with 13–16 named storms, 8–10 hurricanes and 4–6 major hurricanes.

New Preparation for Periodicals Flats in Mixed Area Distribution Center Bundles and Sacks

The Postal Service™ currently provides Periodicals mailers an option to separate residual mail prepared in mixed area distribution center (ADC) bundles and sacks and to create an additional type of mixed ADC bundle and sack. Beginning July 6, 2006, this preparation is mandatory.

Under the new standards, mailers must separate some mixed ADC mail according to the destination ZIP Codes™ in labeling list L201. Pieces that mailers prepare according to L201 are processed with First-Class Mail® items by the processing facility serving the entry office. The remaining mixed ADC mail, destined for ZIP Codes farther from the office of entry, is sent to one of the 34 facilities designated in labeling list L009 for consolidated processing.

The separation allows a significant portion of Periodicals mail prepared in mixed ADC bundles and sacks to be processed with First-Class Mail and travel on the surface transportation network. This preparation improves service for some Periodicals without increasing our processing costs. We are making the standards mandatory to ensure all Periodicals mailers prepare their mail consistently and in a way that improves service.

Mailers continue to have the option to place Automated Flat Sorting Machine (AFSM) 100-compatible mailpieces in ADC and mixed ADC flat trays with lids instead of in ADC and mixed ADC sacks. The minimum quantity per flat tray is 24 pieces of mail. Mailers must not secure mail in bundles when placed in flat trays but must group the mail together by bundle presort destinations.

Postal Service to Test New Verification Process With CD Trading Company

This field information kit is intended to inform Postal Service™ employees of handling procedures for mail that is part of a test beginning in June 2006 for a new postage verification process designed to streamline business mail acceptance and payment.

The customer participating in the test is *la la media, inc.*, an Internet company whose members trade music CDs through the mail using prepaid First-Class Mail® flat-sized envelopes with a permit imprint and unique 4-state customer barcode.

During the test, *la la* will send the Postal Service a daily manifest of CDs being mailed, and postage will be deducted daily from *la la's* Centralized Account Processing System (CAPS) account accordingly. The Postal Service will read Confirm® scans from the *la la* mailpieces sorted on Postal Service automated flat sorting equipment (AFSM 100 or UFSM 1000) and compare the information against the manifests to verify postage.

Mail processing employees need to be aware that the customized *la la* mailing envelopes will be extracted at the Advanced Facer Cancellor System (AFCS) as flats and must be processed on automated flat sorting equipment to verify that postage was paid based on the manifests provided. Address labels may be handwritten and still be AFSM 100– and UFSM 1000–compatible mailpieces.

This new process takes advantage of 4-state customer barcode technology to help make mail visible from creation to entry to delivery, and it will open the door for similar processes in the future.

- *Do not run* these flat-size pieces on letter automation equipment.

- Loosen and remove any heavy clothing.
- Give the person cool water to drink – about a cup every 15 minutes – unless he or she is nauseous or vomiting.
- Fan the victim and spray with a cool mist of water or apply a wet cloth to skin.
- Call 911 for emergency help if the person does not feel better in a few minutes.

HEAT STROKE — A MEDICAL EMERGENCY

Symptoms

- Dry, pale skin with no sweating
- Hot, red skin that looks sunburned
- Mood changes, irritability, confusion or the inability to think clearly
- Seizures
- Inability to revive from an unconscious state

CALL 911 for emergency help IMMEDIATELY.

Take action!

- Move the victim to a cool, shaded area. Don't leave the person alone. Lay the victim on his or her back. Move any nearby objects away if the victim is having seizures. If symptoms include nausea or vomiting, lay the victim on his or her side.
- Loosen and remove any heavy clothing.
- Give the person cool water to drink – about a cup every 15 minutes – unless the victim is nauseous or vomiting.
- Fan the victim and spray with a cool mist of water or wipe the victim with a wet cloth, or cover with a wet sheet.
- Place ice packs under the armpits and groin area.



Return-to-work clearance may be required for absences due to an illness, injury, outpatient medical procedure (surgical), or hospitalization when management has a reasonable belief, based upon reliable and objective information, that:

- a. The employee may not be able to perform the essential functions of his or her position, or
- b. The employee may pose a direct threat to the health or safety of him/herself or others due to that medical condition.

In making this determination, management must consider the essential functions of the employee’s job, the nature of the medical condition or procedure involved, guidance from the occupational health nurse administrator, occupational health nurse, and/or the Postal Service’s physician regarding the condition or procedure involved, and any other reliable and objective information to make an individualized assessment whether there is a reason to require the return-to-work documentation.

In cases of occupational illness or injury, the employee will be returned to work upon certification from the treating physician, and the medical report will be reviewed by a medical officer or contract physician as soon as possible thereafter.

SAFETY TALK

Schools Are Out — Defensive Driving Is No Accident

A defensive driver is one who commits no driving errors and makes allowances for the lack of skill or improper practices of others. A defensive driver compensates for unusual weather, road, and traffic conditions and is not tricked by others' failure to do so. Alert to accident-inducing situations, he or she recognizes in advance the need for preventive action and knows when it is necessary to slow down, stop, or yield the right-of-way to avoid an accident.

Be alert so that children don't get hurt

School bells are now silent and millions of youngsters will be in the neighborhoods during the time we deliver mail. For Postal Service™ drivers, this means more possibilities of unwary young pedestrians wandering into roadways or darting from between cars or hidden places. This is a true test of anyone's defensive driving skills!

In spite of all the training children receive at school, and in spite of parental instruction and admonition, some children play in the street. Most dangerous, perhaps, are those who play merely *near* the street, then suddenly leap out after a ball or to chase a dog.

We know we should be cautious near playgrounds, but we need to take care wherever we drive — and especially in residential areas. Remember the following:

- Always slow down and prepare to stop quickly when you see a ball rolling in the street. A child is likely to be following it.
- Always watch for children coming from all directions when the ice cream vendor starts into the neighborhood.
- Always pay attention to the lone child walking along the street. You are much more likely to overlook a single youngster than a group.

- Always be extremely alert when children (or adults) are on roller skates, skateboards, or roller blades; they can suddenly roll into the street.
- Always watch bicyclists carefully, especially young or novice riders, and give them plenty of room.
- Never back up to redeliver a missed box when mail is out of sequence. Get out of the vehicle, secure it properly, and walk back if you can do so safely.
- Never give mail to children from the vehicle. If children approach, get out of the vehicle and ask them to move away. Double-check around the entire vehicle before proceeding.

Be alert so that pedestrians don't get hurt

And while we're on the subject, this is a good time to talk about pedestrians in general. Here's a fact every driver and pedestrian should know. While fewer than 3 out of 100 accidents involve pedestrians, 3 out of 10 fatalities are pedestrians. In other words, the severity ratio of these accidents is 10 times the frequency ratio. The pedestrian is at a tremendous disadvantage when matched against a moving mass of steel.

I urge all of you to be extra cautious now that school is closed. Let's protect our most precious commodity — our children. Drive defensively at all times and remember that you represent the Postal Service when you get behind the wheel.

Note: The purpose of this safety talk is to generate awareness of child safety in Postal Service—drivers.

District and area Finance managers are designated as the individuals who may order Gift Cheques via the American Express EZ-order Web site for their district or area.

Headquarters vice presidents are asked to designate one Postal Career Executive Service (PCES) manager as the ordering official for their group if they wish to order during the interim period, and forward the name to Julie Moore or Rich Peterson at Headquarters Compensation. Compensation will forward the names of approved ordering officials to American Express. All approved ordering officials will receive, via e-mail, a user ID and password for access to the Web site and instructions on how to place orders. Finance offices are responsible for alerting Compensation when approved ordering officials need to be replaced.

The San Mateo Accounting Service Center (ASC) manager has the authority to approve a PS Form 8230, *Authorization for Payment*, requesting payment to American Express of more than \$10,000.

Interim Ordering Process

1. The requesting office initiates an order by preparing an off-catalog eBuy requisition, listing the name of the approved ordering official (the Finance manager or designated PCES manager) as the last ad hoc approver on the requisition.

2. The approved ordering official orders the Gift Cheques via the EZ-order Web site.
3. American Express sends an order confirmation to the requesting office and mails the Gift Cheques to the mailing address indicated on the order.
4. The requesting office notifies the approved ordering official once the Gift Cheques are received.
5. The approved ordering official reconciles orders and receipts monthly and alerts American Express when orders have not been received.

Interim Payment Process

1. Once an order is placed, American Express sends an invoice to the requesting office.
2. When the requesting office receives the Gift Cheques, it sends the invoice along with a properly completed PS Form 8230 to the San Mateo ASC Scanning and Imaging Center.
- 3a. **For orders up to \$10,000**, San Mateo ASC receives and reviews the invoice and PS Form 8230, then issues payment to American Express.
- 3b. **For orders of \$10,000 or more**, the San Mateo ASC manager receives and reviews the invoice and PS Form 8230 and, if appropriate, authorizes payment. The San Mateo ASC issues payment to American Express.

Process for Reporting American Express Gift Cheques in eAwards

Once awards have been made, the requesting office reports each American Express Gift Cheque in eAwards as the appropriate cash equivalent award.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

over 44" to 46"	20" girth

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

U.S. Flag at Half-Staff

How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.



Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.

Note 1: When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, display the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, *not* at half-staff.

Note 2: On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until 12 noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.

POW-MIA Flag

How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.



Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.



Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.


People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include


postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POSTMARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.





Field Advertising Guidelines and Policy

These Field Advertising Guidelines provide Postal Service™ policy and procedures for preparing advertising to Postal Service customers.

Policy

Postmasters and managers who wish to advertise information to Postal Service customers via postcards, letters, fliers, and signs as well as mass media elements (TV, radio, and print) must use authorized Field Advertising materials.

Local, district, or area levels may not design and produce (or have others design and produce) cards, letters, and fliers intended for distribution to customers, as well as interior or exterior signs that may be viewed by customers, without prior approval by the Headquarters manager of Field Advertising.

In addition, local, district, or area levels may not negotiate or enter contracts for any type of advertising media (TV, radio, or print). If local, district, or area Postal Service personnel have media recommendations they would like considered, they must identify this request to the Headquarters manager of Field Advertising through their respective area advertising coordinator. The Headquarters manager of Field Advertising will then authorize the contracted advertising agency media team to follow up and negotiate and secure the desired media.

These guidelines are designed to protect corporate logos, copyrighted or trademarked products and services, and the overall accuracy, integrity, and image of Postal Service communications.

Definition

“Field Advertising–Authorized Materials” — A collection of postcards, letters, fliers, and signs as well as mass media elements bearing approved images, logos, and messaging in support of a wide range of Postal Service products, services, and issues. Some of these standard advertising documents may be customized using a “multiple

choice” menu of tailored messages, images, and office locations and hours of operation.

Process

Funding — The Headquarters Marketing Department has designated funds for the purpose of field advertising. The Headquarters Marketing Department allocates these funds through the area to support district advertising efforts. The area or district, at its discretion, may allocate additional funds for such use. The Headquarters manager of Field Advertising must approve the Area Advertising Plan for any advertising expenditures. Local promotional initiatives cannot compromise or contradict national campaigns or corporate messaging. The Headquarters manager of Field Advertising provides direction and works with the areas to develop their plans so they are in concert with the Postal Service Corporate Advertising Plan. Local funds that are planned, allocated, and used for advertising and promotional work are carried on Line 39.

Menu of Available Messaging Materials — Postmasters and managers can view the menu of available correspondence and signage tools on the corporate Intranet at <http://blue.usps.gov/wps/portal>; at the top-center of the page, click on *Inside USPS*; under the “Marketing” section, click on *Advertising*; under “Advertising Reference” and under “Media,” click on *Field Advertising*. Here in the Field Advertising section, all creative material available on MessageMaker is provided for viewing. In MessageMaker, authorized users can select from an array of messaging materials promoting many items, such as an Automated Postal Center® (APC®) and passports, or announcing “Grand Openings” and “Extended Service Hours.” Postmasters and managers should make note of the pieces they wish to order and the quantity they need.

Access and Customization — Postmasters and managers can contact their district marketing manager to request these materials. The district marketing manager or designee works with the postmaster or manager to select and customize the materials when customization is available.

The district marketing manager or designee completes PS Form 1357, *Request for Computer Access*, and submits it for approval to the area. The area office completes PS Form 1357 and forwards it to the Headquarters manager of Field Advertising for final authorization and processing. Once ordered, the materials are produced for the requestor in 2–5 business days.

For other material needed for local messaging, advertising, or promotions that are not available on MessageMaker, requesters must work through their area advertising coordinator and the Headquarters manager of Field Advertising for the development, production, and media placement of any material.

To facilitate the use of Field Advertising–authorized materials, training on MessageMaker is available to all authorized users by registering on the MessageMaker home page once you log on. The training is 1 hour and is

offered in a “Webinar” format. Please contact your area advertising coordinator for more training information.

Retail Standardization FAQ

Q: "There are a lot of handbooks and guides that reference how retail lobbies should look (such as Handbook PO-205, *Quick Reference Guide for Postal Retail Lobby Upkeep*, dated 1998; the *Retail Graphic Guidelines* from 2001; etc.). Should I continue to use them?"

A: Many of the previous handbooks and guides focused only on part of the retail equation, while Team Makeover is working to create comprehensive guidelines for all Post Offices to follow. As a result, instructions are constantly updated as feedback from the field is incorporated into the Team Makeover materials. For example, Handbook PO-205 provides outdated information on paint colors and should not be used. New Signage Approval Process

For every sign there is a reason — and authorization. A new retail lobby signage process has been implemented organization-wide to make sure point-of-purchase (POP) signage is most effective and our customers have a consistent, reliable retail experience. As part of this new process, the Vice President, Customer Service will authorize the placement, timing, and content of information that's posted or distributed in Post Office™ lobbies at the request of postal organizations. Retail Marketing will be responsible for coordinating proposed in-store signage. "The look and feel of the retail environment is critical to improving customer satisfaction and sales," said Delivery and Retail VP Ellis Burgoyne and Customer Service VP Susan Plonkey in a letter to U.S. Postal Service® officers. "Our offices vary in size and shape, but through a few simple actions, we can provide our customers with a consistent retail experience from one location to another."

At the area level, proposed signage other than that authorized and provided through the POP program and the direct vendor signage catalog should be coordinated with Headquarters Retail Marketing through area marketing managers before posting. This process will allow the U.S. Postal Service to maintain a consistent customer experience nationwide. It also will ensure that locally developed ideas for new signage will be shared nationally, when appropriate. Of course, this does not apply to signage for safety or temporary signage used during an emergency. Customizable signage that's approved through MessageMaker 3 also is authorized.

"We have seen the improvements in our operations through the implementation of standardized processes," said Burgoyne and Plonkey. "This concept will have the same benefit in our retail operations."
