



**KEEPING THE MAIL SAFE,
AT HOME AND ABROAD**

Founded by Benjamin Franklin in 1737, the United States Postal Inspection Service is one of the oldest federal law enforcement organizations in America. Today, a professional force of approximately 2,200 agents works to enforce over 200 federal laws pertaining to crimes that affect the integrity of the U.S. Mail and postal system. Their mission is to guarantee the trust placed in the Postal Service by the American public: ensuring American businesses the safe exchange of funds and securities through the U.S. Mail; ensuring the safe transmission of each postal customer's correspondence and messages; and maintaining a safe work environment for all postal employees.



WHO WE ARE, WHAT WE DO

Postal Inspectors are problem-solving and investigative federal officers who carry firearms, make arrests, and serve federal search warrants and subpoenas. They work closely with U.S. Attorneys and federal and local law enforcement agencies to investigate a broad scope of cases and prepare them for prosecution, relating to:

- Assaults or threats involving postal employees.
- Counterfeiting.
- Credit card fraud.
- Illicit drug trafficking through the mail.
- Internal crimes.
- Mail bombs.
- Mail fraud.
- Mailing of child pornography.
- Money laundering.
- Protection of postal revenue and assets.
- Recovery of mail in cases of disaster.
- Robberies, burglaries, and homicides.
- Theft of mail.

TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

U.S. Postal Inspectors are among the best-trained law enforcement officers in the country. The training facility is located in the William F. Bolger Center for Leadership Development in Potomac, MD. It combines a beautiful campus with advanced features of an elite training program, including an on-site dormitory, dining, classroom, fitness, and firearms facilities. All Inspectors engage in 14 weeks of scenario-based basic training covering investigative techniques, defensive tactics, firearms, legal matters, search and seizure, arrest techniques, court procedures, postal operations, and a detailed study of federal laws under Postal Inspection Service jurisdiction. The training program focuses on building problem-solving abilities, critical thinking, and cognitive skills.

GENERAL ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

U.S. Postal Inspectors are part of an elite corps that significantly impacts virtually every business, organization, home, and individual in America. In order to measure up to this trust, it is imperative that we demand the highest standards of our applicants. A written examination is required as well as the successful completion of a U.S. Postal Inspection Service assessment center evaluation of applicants' abilities. In addition, all applicants must pass a polygraph examination and a drug screening test.

PRE-APPLICATION CHECKLIST

To qualify for training as a U.S. Postal Inspector, you must check all of these general and medical requirements, and have at least one of the specialized requirements listed below:

- I am a U.S. citizen between the ages of 21 and 36.
- I have a conferred, four-year degree from an accredited college or university.
- I have a valid state driver's license, held for at least two years.
- I have no felony convictions or misdemeanor domestic violence convictions.
- I am able to write and speak English clearly.
- I am in good physical condition (weight proportional to height) and good mental condition.
- I have good vision: 20/100 in each eye without glasses (Snellen), corrected to at least 20/30 in one eye and 20/40 in the other eye, with good color perception. (Individuals who have undergone radial keratotomy (RK) are considered unsuitable for the position of Postal Inspector.)
- I have normal hearing (ability to hear ordinary conversation from 15 feet, without a hearing aid).

SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS

- I have a background in at least one of these specialized areas:
 - Foreign language expertise.
 - Internal audit expertise.
 - Juris doctorate.
 - Law enforcement expertise.
 - Military officers.
 - Postal Service supervisory experience.

HOW TO APPLY

For an application, call your nearest U.S. Postal Inspection Service Field Division (phone numbers located on the back cover) and ask for the recruitment specialist.
